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- 1 EXAMINER JONES: Let's start the docket
- 2 with the last case of the day, which is 15473,
- 3 application of BTA Oil Producers, LLC, for an order
- 4 directing Cimarex Energy Company to shut-in its
- 5 overproduced oil wells in the Berry; Bone Spring North
- 6 Pool, assessing production penalties for the
- 7 overproduction and ordering compliance with the
- 8 Division's Oil Proration Rules for the Berry; Bone
- 9 Spring, North Pool, in Lea County, New Mexico.
- 10 Call for appearances.
- 11 MS. KESSLER: Mr. Examiner, Jordan Kessler,
- 12 from the Santa Fe office of Holland and Hart, on behalf
- 13 of BTA Oil Producers, LLC.
- 14 EXAMINER JONES: Other appearances?
- 15 MS. BRADFUTE: Mr. Examiner, Jennifer
- 16 Bradfute on behalf of Cimarex Oil Company.
- 17 MR. HERRMANN: And Mr. Examiner, Keith
- 18 Herrmann representing the Oil Conservation Division
- 19 Compliance and Enforcement Bureau.
- 20 MS. KESSLER: Mr. Examiner, this was BTA's
- 21 application that was initially brought against Cimarex.
- 22 I think that several other entities have entered their
- 23 appearance, but Cimarex has obtained waivers from them
- 24 today.
- MS. BRADFUTE: That is correct,

- 1 Mr. Examiner. I have emails from the other operators
- 2 within the adjoining sections indicating that they have
- 3 no objections to the settlement. I can provide those.
- 4 EXAMINER JONES: Any objection to them
- 5 presenting the waivers?
- 6 MS. KESSLER: So Mr. Examiners, Exhibit 1
- 7 is a copy of the Settlement Agreement which has been
- 8 signed by both Cimarex and BTA and pending signature
- 9 from the Oil Conservation Division counsel. But my
- 10 understanding is that that will be -- that we've
- 11 received verbal approval of that.
- MR. HERRMANN: Yes. Once we have the
- originals, the Oil Conservation Division will execute
- 14 the final agreement.
- 15 EXAMINER JONES: So Exhibit 1 is from BTA?
- MS. KESSLER: Is from BTA. Again, that's
- 17 been signed by BTA and Cimarex. Exhibit A to Exhibit 1
- 18 is the curtailment plan that was agreed to in the
- 19 Settlement Agreement, and it sets forth the timing and
- 20 the curtailment of production for Cimarex's well.
- 21 EXAMINER JONES: Okay. And so Exhibits 2,
- 22 3 and 4 are from Cimarex?
- MS. BRADFUTE: That is correct,
- 24 Mr. Examiners. Exhibits 2, 3 and 4 include email
- 25 correspondence between myself and COG Operating,

- 1 Nearburg, and with Yates Petroleum.
- 2 And we have coordinated beforehand with
- 3 Keith Herrmann to see what type of information the
- 4 Division would need in order to make sure that there
- 5 were no objections, and we were including all the
- 6 operators.
- 7 EXAMINER JONES: Okay. So the continuance
- 8 is just till you finalize your negotiations?
- 9 MS. KESSLER: I don't know that we need a
- 10 continuance. It simply needs to be signed by counsel
- 11 from the Division. And I think, with that, it could be
- 12 taken under advisement.
- 13 THE COURT: Is that agreeable to all
- 14 parties?
- MS. BRADFUTE: Yes, it is.
- 16 EXAMINER JONES: Mr. Brooks?
- 17 EXAMINER BROOKS: I have no questions.
- 18 EXAMINER JONES: Is this all legally
- 19 kosher?
- 20 EXAMINER BROOKS: Yes. I have conferred
- 21 with counsel for the Division Enforcement Bureau
- 22 previously, and I believe the settlement is in
- 23 accordance with the law.
- 24 EXAMINER JONES: Does the settlement entail
- 25 an agreement for other parties who overproduce out here.

- 1 MR. HERRMANN: No.
- 2 MS. BRADFUTE: Mr. Examiner, there is a
- 3 provision in the agreement which would -- it says, "This
- 4 agreement does not prohibit any operator from later
- 5 filing an application concerning the allowables or other
- 6 types of application."
- 7 No applications are currently being
- 8 drafted.
- 9 MS. KESSLER: But for the time being,
- 10 Mr. Examiner, the Settlement Agreement does require
- 11 curtailment to make up for overproduction.
- 12 EXAMINER JONES: Okay. So are you asking
- 13 for dismissal of the case?
- MS. KESSLER: At this point yes, I would
- 15 ask for a dismissal and that the Settlement Agreement be
- 16 approved by the Division.
- MR. HERRMANN: No objections.
