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APPLICATION OF OPAL RESOURCES OPERATING CO., LLC AND OPAL RESOURCES II, LLC FOR A NON-STANDARD SPACING AND PRORATION UNIT, A NON-STANDARD PROJECT AREA, AND COMPULSORY POOLING, LEA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.

## APPLICATION

Opal Resources Operating Co., LLC and Opal Resources II, LLC (collectively, "Opal") through its attorneys Carson Ryan LLC (Elizabeth A. Ryan) hereby files this application with the Oil Conservation Division pursuant to the provisions of NMSA 1978, Sec. 70-2-17, for an order (1) creating a 200-acre, more or less, spacing and proration unit comprised of W/2W/2 of Section 29 and NW/4NW/4 of Section 32, Township 19 South, Range 39 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico; and (2) approving a non-standard 200-acre project area; and (3) pooling all mineral interests in the Nadine/Abo Formation. In support of its Application, Opal, states:

1. Opal Resources II, LLC is a working interest owner in proposed non-standard spacing and proration unit/project area and has the right to drill a well thereon.

2. Opal proposes to dedicate the above referenced spacing and proration unit as a non-standard project area for the proposed **Jade 19S-39E-S29 No. 1H Well** which will be horizontally drilled from the surface location of 400 feet FNL and 400 feet FWL (Unit D) Section 29 to the Nadine/Abo Formation and across the section line at the bottom hole location of 1122 feet FNL and 400 feet FWL (Unit D) of Section 32. *See C-102 Plat* attached hereto as Exhibit A.

3. The proposed project area is comprised of W/2W/2 Section 29 and the NW/4NW/4 Section 32, Township 19 South, Range 39 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico. The project area is non-standard because it crosses the section line from Section 29 to Section 32.

4. The producing interval for this Well will cross the section line but will meet the 330-foot standard offset from the outer boundaries of the project area as required by the Statewide Rules for horizontal wells in 19.15.16.15. *See Exhibit A*.

5. Opal has sought in good faith to obtain the voluntary joinder of all mineral interest owners in the subject spacing unit.

6. Although Opal attempted to obtain voluntary agreements from all mineral interest owners to participate in the drilling of the well or to otherwise commit their interest to the well, certain interest owners have failed or refused to join in dedicating their interests. Therefore, Opal seeks an order pooling all mineral interest owners in the W/2W/2 of Section 29 and NW/4NW/4 of Section 32, pursuant to NMSA 1978, §§ 70-2-17 and 18.

7. Notice has also been provided to all affected parties in adjacent spacing units to the proposed non-standard spacing unit/project area pursuant to Rule 19.15.4(A)(3) NMAC.

8. In order to permit Opal to obtain its just and fair share of the oil and gas underlying the subject lands, all uncommitted interests in this non-standard spacing unit/project area should be pooled and it is necessary to prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, Opal requests that, this Application be set for hearing before an Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on January 19, 2016, and, after notice and hearing, the Division enter its order:

- A. Creating a 200-acre, more or less, non-standard spacing and proration unit comprised of W/2W/2 Section 29 and NW/4NW/4 Section 32, Township 19 South, Range 39 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico;
- B. Approving a non-standard 200-acre non-standard project area;
- C. Pooling all the mineral interests in the Nadine/Abo Formation underlying the nonstandard spacing and proration unit;
- D. Designating Opal Operating Co., LLC as the contract operator of this nonstandard spacing unit and horizontal well to be drilled thereon;
- E. Considering the cost of drilling and completing the well, and allocating its costs among the well's interest owners;
- F. Approving actual operating charges and costs charged for supervision, together with a provision adjusting the rates pursuant to the COPAS accounting procedure; and
- G. Setting a 200% penalty for the risk assumed by Opal in drilling and completing the well against any working interest owner who does not voluntarily elect to participate in the drilling of the well.



Applicant in the above styled cause seeks an order (1) creating a non-standard, 200-acre, more or less, spacing and proration unit comprised of W/2W/2 Section 29 and NW/4NW/4 Section 32, Township 19 South, 39 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico; (2) approving a non-standard project area; and (3) pooling all mineral interests in the Nadine/Abo Formation underlying said acreage. Said non-standard unit is to be dedicated to Applicant's Jade 19S-39E-S29 No. 1H Well, to be vertically drilled from the surface location in NW/4NW/4 (Unit D) of Section 29 to the Nadine/Abo Formation to the bottom hole location of in NW/4NW/4 (Unit D) of Section 32. The completed interval for this well will remain within the 330foot standard offset required by the Rules. Also to be considered will be the cost of drilling and completing the well and the allocation of the costs thereof, as well as actual operating costs and charges for supervision, designation of Opal Resources Operating Co., LLC as operator of the well, and a 200% penalty for risk involved in the drilling the well.
