Mr. Karger:

The Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has received your application for a surface waste management facility. It is OCD's understanding that you are the sole principal officer of CK Disposal, LLC and the only owner with at least 25% interest in the entity. The OCD finds your application to be administratively complete. Given this determination, you may now proceed to the notice as specified in 19.15.36.9(A) NMAC. As the applicant, you are required to furnish proof to OCD that required notices have been given. Please provide this proof to OCD as soon as possible.

OCD will also provide notice of its administrative completeness determination per 19.15.36.9(B) NMAC. The public has 30 days to comment from the date of notice provided by the applicant or the date that OCD distributes notice, whichever is later. (See 19.15.36.9(C) NMAC)

The determination of administrative completeness does not mean that the application meets the technical requirements of 19.15.36 NMAC. OCD is evaluating the technical merits of your application. Within 60 days after the end of the public comment period, OCD will issue its tentative decision regarding your application. (See 19.15.36.9(D) NMAC)
