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

Dear Mr. Fesmire:

Since the Oil Conservation Commission hearing dockets for November and December 2005 must be devoted to rule hearings, Devon Energy Production Company requests that the above referenced cases be continued from the November 10, 2005 Commission hearing docket to the Oil Conservation Commission docket scheduled for January 12, 2006. It will take at least one hearing day to present these cases and the pending Bass Enterprises Production Co. case for a well location in the Potash Area. Therefore, unless the January 12th docket is devoted to the Division's proposed Pit Rules, Devon also requests that these de novo hearings, and the other pending case for a location in the Potash Area, be scheduled first on that docket.
