PROPOSED ADVERTISEMENT

Case No. 13960 (reopened): Application of Parallel Petroleum Corporation for compulsory pooling, Chaves County, New Mexico. Applicant seeks an order pooling all mineral interests from the surface to the base of the Wolfcamp formation underlying the S/2 of Section 9, Township 15 South, Range 25 East, NMPM, to form a standard 320-acre gas spacing and proration unit for all formations developed on 320 acre spacing within that vertical extent, including the Undesignated Walnut Creek-Wolfcamp Gas Pool. The unit is to be dedicated to the proposed War Emblem 1525-9 Fed. Com. Well No. 1H, to be drilled at a surface location 1880 feet from the south line and 190 feet from the east line of Section 8, Township 15 South, Range 25 East, N.M.P.M., with a penetration point 1880 feet from the south line and 660 feet from the west line of Section 9 and a terminus 1880 feet from the south line and 660 feet from the east line of Section 9. Also to be considered will be the cost of drilling and completing the well and the allocation of the cost thereof, as well as actual operating costs and charges for supervision, designation of applicant as operator of the well, and a 200% charge for the risk involved in drilling and completing the well. The unit is located approximately 5 miles northwest of Lake Arthur, New Mexico.
