I may be repeating myself, either by letter or telephone, however I am still attempting to "round-up" all the devisees or their heirs out of the J. W. Blankenchip Estate and at this point I am trying to keep up with some 30 different people.

As I may have mentioned, or you may know, Eagle Resources, a small company here in Roswell, NM is planning to re-enter and re-work a dryhole that was drilled on Section 34 back in the early 1990s.

The New Mexico State regulatory Agency, Oil & Gas Division of the Energy and Minerals Department, requires that all owners of any interest must be contacted and some sort of trade made, or attempted to be made, before the Agency will issue a Permit to either drill or re-work.

Back in 1992 Eva Edwards granted an Oil & Gas Lease to Marshall Pipe & Supply. Her address was C/O Claude McCay, 1644 Grimes Ave., Modesto. From information I have obtained from some of the other Devisees and heirs you are Ms. Edwards grandson, and I assume the son of Clyde McCay.

Ms. Edwards owned a 1/12 of 1/8th mineral interest under the  $E_2^{1/2}$  Sec. 34, being a 3.33 net mineral acres. I am attaching a list of the 1982 Distribution out of the Blankenchip Estate showing all the devisees and their interests.

If Ms. Edwards left a Will, her interest would pass to whoever she named in the Will. If I am correct, you and Mrs. Watson, (Frances), had 4 children; two boys named Steve and Gale and two daughters named Cindy and Sandy.

Mrs. Watson inherited a 1/96th mineral interest under the  $E_{2}^{l}$  Sec. 34, being 3.33 net mineral acres. Pursuant to telephone conversation I am enclosing a plat showing the acreage under which Bevo Webb has a mineral interest. B. F. Cook obtained this 20/2080 mineral interest in the 1950s. B. F. apparently died in the early 1980s and Bessie Cook owned the interest until 1993 when she Willed all her interest to "good friend" Bevo Webb.

20/2080 is 0.961538% and will be 6.1538 net mineral acres under the Section 34 only. Eagle Resources here in Roswell is planning to re-enter the abandoned hole located on Sec. 34 and attempt a completion.

There are, at last count, some 52 mineral owners under this Sec. 34, which 52 includes 7 deceased persons. We have obtained some 36 leases on this Section and can offer you, as Attorney in Fact for Bevo, the same as all the other owners, which was \$25.00 per acre bonus consideration plus \$2.00 per acre advance delay rentals, (\$27.00), for a 3 year "Paid-up" lease with 3/16ths royalty. \$27.00 X 6.1538 acres = \$166.15.

In order to include the interests of missing mineral owners, their probable heirs, and possible others with very minor interests, Eagle is having a hearing before the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division, our Regulatory Agency, to obtain approval for pooling unleased interests into a 320 acre proration unit.

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
