I recommend that we file suit against Sovereign Oil Company to assess the appropriate penalties.







The road to the Navajo Lake well was badly gutted during the winter drilling. The sides of the road had to be pulled back in. It was necessary to re-crown the road, and to put in reconstructed water bars (a type of road drainage). Also, the construction company Gosney & Sons of Durango, Colorado, moved a cattle guard and re-installed it. There was some minor fence repair done. A total of 4160 feet of road was graveled.

This work was done under the direction of:

Mr. Rex Edwards - Bureau of Reclamation

Mr. Bob Rouse - Colorado Fish and Wild Life

The work has been approved and we will receive a letter shortly from Mr. Edwards so stating.

The road engineering was handled by Mr. Don Gosney of the Gosney Construction Company.
