

1 the bottom perforation in that wellbore trace, coming from
2 the speckled yellow horizon on the cross-section, which is
3 the Atoka sand, and it made a 124,000-barrel well out of
4 that unit. And it's currently producing approximately 20
5 barrels per day from that horizon.

6 Q. Are there any producing wells back to the east of
7 this proposed proration unit?

8 A. In the east half of 12 off this map are two
9 Nearburg wells that are productive from the Strawn line.

10 Q. How about the west half of -- I'm sorry --

11 A. Of 12?

12 Q. How about the west half of the southwest quarter
13 of 12?

14 A. No, sir, that -- The Texas Byers well in there is
15 productive -- or was productive from the Atoka sand as
16 well.

17 Q. Okay.

18 A. It was not a Strawn well.

19 Q. Who controls that acreage or who is the lessee of
20 record?

21 A. Well, we control a portion of the southwest
22 quarter of 12, as well as Nearburg.

23 EXAMINER STOGNER: Was Nearburg contacted, Mr.
24 Carr?

25 MR. CARR: Nearburg was provided a copy of the

1 exhibits, and the Application has been reviewed with them.

2 And since we were moving only to the east 150 feet, would
3 be within the tolerance allowed by the Humble City-Strawn
4 Pool rules, there was, I understand, no objection.

5 They were present and reviewed the proposal with
6 us here today.

7 Q. (By Examiner Stogner) How would you classify
8 these little -- Are these algal mounds?

9 A. Yes, sir, they are.

10 Q. Little pods out there?

11 The structure, or the depiction on Exhibit No. 6,
12 were there any seismic lines to help come up with this?

13 A. No, sir. Typically we use seismic, but this was
14 an instance where we felt that the well control was solid
15 enough that we had a legitimate idea here.

16 EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay. Any other questions of
17 this witness?

18 MR. CARR: No further questions, Mr. Stogner.

19 EXAMINER STOGNER: He may be excused.

20 MR. CARR: We have nothing further in this case.

21 EXAMINER STOGNER: In that case, case 11,098 will
22 be taken under advisement.


