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
Proposed notification/advertisement for OCD docket

Case ________: Application of Marathon Oil Company for an unorthodox oil well location, Lea County, New Mexico. Applicant, in the above-styled cause, seeks approval to drill its Lea Unit Well No. 17 at an unorthodox oil well location 900 feet from the South line and 1756 feet from the East line (Unit O) of Section 13, Township 20 South, Range 34 East, NMPM. Said well is to be dedicated to a standard 160-acre oil spacing and proration unit consisting of the SE/4 of said Section 13. Said unit is located approximately 3 miles south of a point along U.S Highway 62/180 approximately 12 miles northeast of the intersection of Highway 62/180 and State Highway 176, New Mexico.

APPLICATION

Comes now MARATHON OIL COMPANY, by and through its attorneys, KELLAHIN and KELLAHIN, and applies to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division for approval to drill its Lea Unit Well No. 17 at an unorthodox oil well location 900 feet FSL and 1756 feet FEL (Unit O) Section 13, Township 20 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico for possible production from the Devonian formation and to be dedicated to a standard 160 acre oil spacing unit consisting of the SE/4 of said Section 13.

In support thereof, Applicant states:

- 1. Applicant, Marathon Oil Company ("Marathon"), is the operator of the Lea Unit which produces oil from the Lea-Devonian Pool and which includes all of said Section 13. [See Exhibit "A"]
- 2. Marathon proposes to drill the Lea Unit Well No. 17 within the current boundaries of the Lea-Devonian Pool and therefore is subject to Special Rules and Regulations set forth in Order R-1826-A which provide in Rule 3 that:

"The initial well in any 160-acre unit in said pool shall be located within 150 feet of the center of either the NW/4 or SE/4 of the quarter section on which the well is located."

- 3. While Rule 2 and Rule 5 of the Pool provide for additional wells within the same 160-acre oil spacing unit, Rule 3 only refers to the initial well.
- 4. The Lea Unit Well No. 3 was the initial well in the SE/4 of said Section 13 and was drilled 1980 feet from the South line and 1980 feet from the East line of Section 13 which is both a standard footage and an "on-pattern" location.
- 5. Geologic and engineering evaluations have concluded that the Lea Unit Well No. 3 cannot and will not fully deplete its 160-acre spacing unit and an additional "in-fill" well is necessary in order to effectively and efficiently recovery the reserves under that spacing unit.
- 6. A 3-D seismic survey indicates that the optimum location in the SE/4 of Section 13 for such an "in-fill" well is at an unorthodox location 915 feet from the South line and 1778 feet from the East line of Section 13.
- 7. Marathon seeks approval of that unorthodox well location so that it can drilled its proposed Lea Unit Well No. 17.
- 8. To do so Marathon seeks an exception to Rule 3 of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Lea-Devonian Pool to permit the Lea Unit Well No. 17 to be located at what may be considered to be both an unorthodox "footage" and an "off-pattern" location.
- 9. The well only encroaches towards spacing units which are also part of the Lea-Unit within Section 36 which has the same ownership as the subject 160-acre spacing unit.

- 10. Approval of the application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the hydrocarbons in this portion of the Devonian formation and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.
- 11. In accordance with Division Rule 1207, notification is being sent to those parties listed on Exhibit "B".

WHEREFORE, Applicant requests that, after notice and hearing, this Application be approved as requested.
