



> Re: Case No. 11514 Order No. R-10622-A Read & Stevens, Inc.

Dear Commissioners:

Read & Stevens, Inc. ("Read & Stevens") filed an Application for Rehearing, in which they state that a penalty on its well is not necessary because "reservoir properties are not identical," and that "the reservoir is thicker around the Read & Stevens location than at the UMC well." Application for Rehearing, p.11, $\P(1)$. That is incorrect. Although Read & Stevens theorized at the hearing that its location would encounter over 30 feet of net pay (Read & Stevens Exhibit No. 2), in fact the well actually encountered only 13 feet of net pay. This figure can be verified from the log Read & Stevens is required to submit to the Division. well's results discredit Read & Stevens' engineering simulation, especially its calculated qas-in-place, and support the penalty imposed by the Commission.

Therefore, UMC Petroleum Corporation requests that the Application for Rehearing be <u>denied</u>.
