

CASE 11533: Application of Mewbourne Oil Company for compulsory pooling and an unorthodox gas well location, Eddy County, New Mexico. Applicant in the above-styled cause seeks an order pooling all mineral interests from surface to the base of the Morrow formation underlying the N/2 of Section 4 for all formations developed on 320-acre spacing, the NW/4 of Section 4 for all formations developed on 160-acre spacing, the S/2 NW/4 of Section 4 for all formations developed on 80-acre spacing and the SW/4 NW/4 of Section 4 for all formations developed on 40-acre spacing, all in Township 18 South, Range 28 East. Applicant proposes to dedicate this pooled unit to a well to be drilled at an unorthodox gas well location 1650 feet from the North line and 990 feet from the West line of said Section to test any and all formations from the surface to the base of the Morrow formation, Illinois Camp-Morrow Gas Pool. Also to be considered will be the cost of drilling and completing said well and the allocation of the cost thereof as well as actual operating costs and charges for supervision, designation of applicant as operator of the well and a charge for risk involved in drilling said well.
