Dear Ms. Wrotenbery:

On behalf of Matador Petroleum Corporation ("Matador") and in accordance with the provisions of the referenced order, I am requesting a 30-day extension to January 1, 2002 in order to commence this well and in support states:

- (1) the order was entered effective January 31, 2001 and provided that this well shall be commenced on or before May 1, 2001;
- (2) on April 23, 2001, Matador applied to the Division for an extension which was granted on April 23, 2001 extending the commencement date to August 1, 2001;
- (3) Matador was unable to commence the well by August 1, 2001 and sought and obtained another extension to December 1, 2001.

(4) Matador now seeks an additional 30-day extension because the rig which was scheduled to move to this location and commence the well is delayed for repairs. A 30-day extension should allow sufficient time for any contingencies due to rig repairs.
