Dear Mr. Livingston:

I have given considerable thought to the matter of our application to pull the casing from the H.L. Williams wells. I have prepared a form of order which, in my opinion, will protect the structures involved, and carry out the purposes for which the Oil Conservation Commission was constituted without involving the Oil Conservation Commission in any dispute over the right to pull the casing. This is simply in adjudication of what must be done before the casing can be pulled by the rightful owners without being an express authorization to Nipper and Finkelstein, or a determination that they are the rightful owners. With such an order as this to protect us from criminal action by the Conservation Commission, we are perfectly willing to litigate with Mr. Williams, any controversy over pulling the casing or damage to the well.

I would appreciate it very much if you would give careful consideration to this form of order and advise me whether, in your opinion, the Commission would be justified in issuing the same as it now is or with any changes which you might suggest.

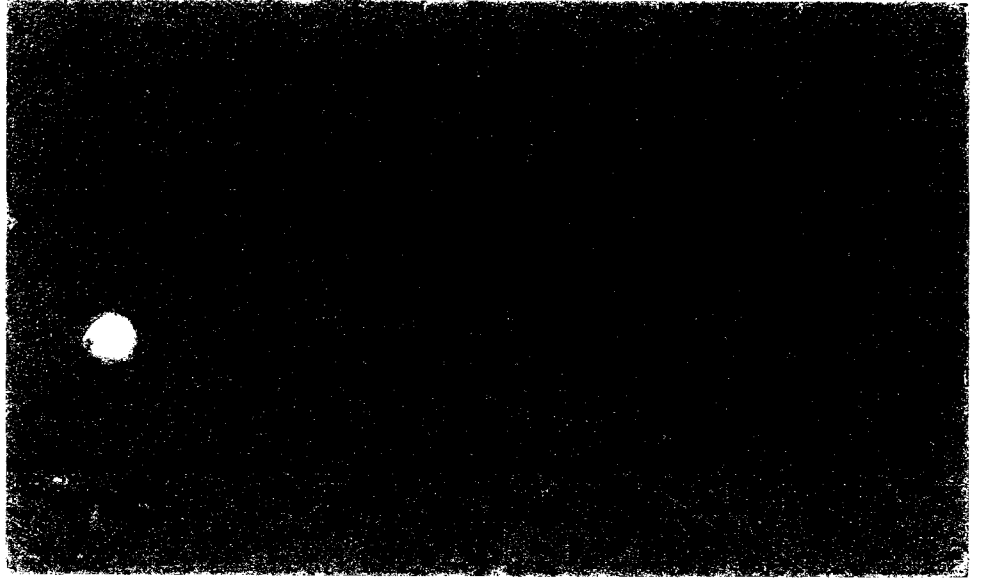
