Dear Sir:

You have furnished this office with a copy of the petition of Roland Rich Woolley, Paton Brothers and Sergeant, Aston and Fair, and Premier Petroleum Corporation, filed with the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico, for approval of an unorthodox well spacing plan and proration plan for a part of the Premier pool, Eddy County, New Mexico.

The application covers thirteen 80-acre tracts or units in secs. 25, 26 and 27, T. 17 S., R. 30 E., all of which are embraced in Federal oil and gas leases. Approval is requested to drill two additional wells in each 80-acre tract to be located 330 feet from the outer boundary of each tract and 50 feet from the common boundary of the two 40-acre tracts included in each tract. The additional wells are to be drilled to more effectively drain the area and to prevent underground waste by loss of otherwise unrecoverable oil.

The application also provides for approval by the Commission of a proration plan so that production allowables may be granted on completion of oil wells at the unorthodox well locations.

This office offers no objection to the application as submitted to the Oil Conservation Commission and is of the opinion that the drilling of additional wells will be beneficial in securing the greatest ultimate recovery of oil and gas from the reservoir of the Premier pool. Permission to drill additional wells at the unorthodox locations cited in the application will be granted by the Geological Survey upon receipt of notice of approval of the application by the Oil Conservation Commission.

The lands covered by the application are included in Federal oil and gas leases Las Cruces 028992(a), (b), (c), (e), (g), (i), 030579(b), 052376 and 060521.
