

Dear Dick:

Enclosed are drafts of Orders in Cases No. 243, 244 and 245. I recommend that these Orders be adopted.

Also enclosed is Order setting dates for the proration hearings for the year 1951. This Order bears an "A" prefix since it relates to allocation of oil. If these dates are the ones you finally determine on, I recommend that this Order be issued between the 1st and 10th of January, 1951.

Also enclosed is Notice of the Hearings set for the Year 1951. This should be published in each oil producing county as well as in Santa Fe County, one time between the 1st and 10th of January, 1951.

I have just noticed that Thomas J. Mabrysname was inserted in the Notice and Order relating to allowable hearings. Since these both must be dated after the 1st of January, the name of Governor Meacham should be substituted for that of Governor Mabry.

Relative to changing our system of having a one-month proration period and making a two-month proration period, I do not recommend that we make such a change at this time. All of our rules and regulations are set up on the basis of a one-month proration period for oil. Like-wise our forms are adapted to a one-month proration period. In order to change this, it would be necessary to amend many of the rules and rewrite many of the printed forms. Therefore, I think the question of making this change should be given serious thought and no action should be taken on it at this time.

Gentlemen:

Reference is made to the hearing on Case No. 243 which will be held in Santa Fe on December 22, 1950. We regret that circumstances will prevent our being represented at this hearing and request that the following statement be included in the records of the hearing.

The Texas Company has long advocated the use of bottom hole pressure as a factor in the allocation of oil to minimize or prevent the migration of oil across property lines. We believe that in many fields the use of an adequate bottom hole pressure factor will result in extremely fair and equitable allocation of oil and prevent waste and confiscation of property. In both the Monument and Hobbs Fields the large per acre recovery of oil with a relatively small and very gradual decline in reservoir pressure indicates efficient operation of these reservoirs. We wish to compliment the Commission for adopting rules based on sound engineering principles to regulate and control the production of oil from these fields.

We believe that it is impractical to continue the present orders for these fields since the Commission does not have the equipment to take bottom hole pressures; however, the rule could be rewritten requiring the operators to furnish this information. After carefully studying the reservoir performance and giving consideration to the stage of depletion and the apparent type of drive mechanism of these two fields, we are of the opinion that the continued use of the bottom hole pressure factor in the allocation formula would not materially improve the efficiency or increase the ultimate recovery from these fields.

Reference is made to Case No. 243 regarding <del>33 and</del> 398. rescission of Commission Orders No. Magnolia Petroleum Company is not interested in the phase of the above hearing involving Order No. 33 or the Monument Tool. However, we would like for the record to show that Magnolia Fetroleum Company is interested in the Hobbs Pool and we do recommend that Order No. 398 be rescinded. It is our opinion that since the bottom hole pressure of all wells in the Tobbs Fool is fairly uniform, the effect of such a change in allocation method would be negligible and no operator would gain or lose a substantial amount of oil. Conversion to a 100% acrease allocation formula would simplify the assignment of the allowables since no bottom hole pressure calculations would be involved.



Dear Dick:

Replying to your letter of September 26, 1950, we have prepared a report showing the transfers of allowables as they would affect the companies in the event the contemplated change in the proration formula for the Monument and Hobbs Fields takes place.

You will note that quite a few of the companies are affected, some of them materially. Since the Humble's position in this change is rather minor, that is a loss of 17 barrels in the Monument Field and a gain of 9 barrels in the Hobbs Field, we are reluctant to make any recommendations as to whether or not this action should take place. I would suggest that you contact some of the companies affected the most and determine their attitude before calling for an open discussion on this subject. I do not feel that it is important enough at this time to create a situation that would cause a great amount of dissension.

With reference to the high ratio wells in the Drinkard Field, I would like to suggest that after your Nomenclature Committee has had an opportunity to classify this field, that is whether oil or gas, or whether the gas being produced is associated or non-associated, that a hearing be called at the instance of the Commission to determine the most effective permissible gas oil ratio.

I will be glad to discuss these suggestions further with you at any time, or arrange for a meeting of the operating engineers to assist in any way to collect whatever data you may need.

Dear Dick:

With reference to the attached letter and the tabulations on the Hobbs and Monument Pools, here are some facts for your consideration. The point has been made that if there is to be a complete divorcement of proration from the Les County Operators Johnsttee it will be necessary for the Commission to make the pressure survey for the Hobbs and Monument Pools. Order # 33 states that the Monument pressures shall be taken every three months and order # 398 states that the Hobbs pressures shall be determined every six months. However, by verbal authority from the Commission the pressure surveys are only taken once a year at present. The next surveys are to be taken in February for the Hobbs Pool and in April and May for the Monument Pool.

I doubt if there would be any serious objection on the part of the operators in the Hobbs Pool to doing away with pressures as a factor in proration. I do not know the opinion of any of the Monument operators, but it is my opinion that these orders will have to be rescinded or rewritten before the next pressure survey.
