CONTINENTAL OIL COMPANY STATEMENT IN CASE NO. 1060

Continental Oil Company has no objection to the dual completion of Texas Company's A. H. Blinebry (NCT-1) well in the Blinebry and Tubb gas pools. We do object, however, to the dedication for allowable purposes of more than 160 acres to this well. Continental has expressed its views on several occasions at hearings on applications for oversized proration units in the Tubb gas pool.

We should like to point out again that there is no finding by the Commission that a well will drain in excess of 160 acres in the Tubb. We therefore, respectfully request that this proposed unit be limited in size to 160 acres.
