IN THE MATTER OF:

Southeastern New Mexico nomenclature case calling for the creation of new pools and the extension of existing pools in Lea, Chaves and Eddy Counties, New Mexico.

- (a) Creation of a new oil pool for Queen production, designated as the Cedar Point-Queen pool, and described as:

TOWNSHIP 15 SOUTH, RANGE 30 EAST
Section 23: SE/4

- (b) Creation of a new oil pool for Devonian production, designated as the Spencer-Devonian Pool, and described as:

TOWNSHIP 17 SOUTH, RANGE 36 EAST
Section 25: NW/4

- (c) Extension of the Baish pool to include:

TOWNSHIP 17 SOUTH, RANGE 32 EAST
Section 16: SW/4

- (d) Extension of the Corbin-Yates Pool to include:

TOWNSHIP 18 SOUTH, RANGE 33 EAST
Section 16: NE/4

- (e) Extension of the E-K Queen Pool to include:

TRANSCRIPT OF HEARING

MR. PORTER: We are going to take up next the southeast nomenclature case which we believe we can get through with in about fifteen minutes. That will be the last case taken before the noon recess. The first case after noon will be Case 1082 relative to the various gas pools in southeast, New Mexico. The case now to be considered is Case 1083.

R A N D A L L M O N T G O M E R Y

having first been duly sworn, testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

By MR. GURLEY:

Q Would you state your name, please?

A Randall Montgomery.

Q What is your position?

A Geologist, New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission.

Q Have you qualified before this Commission before?

A Yes, I have.

Q Mr. Montgomery, in your official capacity as geologist

for the Oil Conservation Commission of the State of New Mexico, have you had an opportunity to study the proposed creation of a new oil pool for the Queen production designated the Cedar Point-Queen Pool in southeast, New Mexico? A Yes, sir, I have.

Q Would you state to the Commission your conclusion as a result of the study and your recommendation?

A I recommend that the pool be created as advertised. The pool was discovered by the Leonard Oil Company. The discovery well was the Well No. 2, Lois C. Hobbs, in Unit I of 23-15-30, completed on 4-3-1956 in the Queen Formation. Top of the perforation is 2770'. I recommend that the pool be created as advertised.

Q Have you also had an opportunity to study the proposed creation of new oil pool for Devonian production designated as the Spencer-Devonian Pool? A Yes, I have.

Q What are your recommendations and conclusion?

A I recommend that the pool be created as advertised, that being the Spencer-Devonian, the northwest quarter of Section 25, Township 17 South, Range 36 East. The discovery well in this field was the J. C. Williamson Spencer Unit No. 1 located in Unit C of Section 25, completed on 5/7/56, the dcs. 11,033 feet to the Devonian.

Q Have you had an opportunity to study the proposed extension of the Baish Pool?

A Yes, sir. I recommend that the Baish Pool be extended as advertised.

Q Have you had an opportunity to study the proposed extension of the Corbin-Yates?

A Yes, and I further recommend that it be extended as advertised.

Q Have you made a study of the proposed extension of the E. K.-Queen Pool?

A Yes, I have. I recommend that it be extended as advertised, and also there was an unadvertised portion, the south half of Section 14, Township 18 South, Range 33 East. I recommend that it be extended to include that area also and is continuous and contiguous.

Q It is contiguous acreage?

A To the present pool, that is correct.

Q To that which was advertised? A No, to the pool.

Q Have you had an opportunity to study the proposed extension of the Jalmat Pool?

A Yes, sir, I recommend that it be extended as advertised.

Q Have you made a study of the proposed extension of the Langlie-Mattix?

A I have. I further recommend that it be extended as advertised.

Q You made a study of the proposed extension of the North Mason-Delaware Pool?

A I have and I recommend it be extended as advertised.

Q Have you made an opportunity to study the proposed extension of the Wantz-Abo Pool?

A Yes, sir, I have. I recommend that pool be extended as advertised.

Q Do you have any exhibits to introduce at this time?

A Yes, sir. I have marked them Exhibits 1 through 10 inclusive.

MR. GURLEY: I would like to move that the Exhibits 1 through 10 be admitted.

MR. PORTER: Without objection they will be admitted. Any questions?

MR. NUTTER: One question.

CROSS EXAMINATION

By MR. NUTTER:

Q What was the additional extension?

A The south half of Section 14, Township 18 South, Range 33 East.

MR. NUTTER: That is all.

MR. GURLEY: That is all we have in this case.

MR. PORTER: The witness may be excused and the case taken under advisement.

(Witness excused.)
