Subsequent to our conversation Friday morning, Mr. Dick Davenport of Western Development Company called John Runyon at Hobbs and found that he had already mailed the January, 1961, nomenclature advertisement. Therefore, I am sending you an addition to that advertisement as follows:

- 1) Delete a portion of the Red Lake Pool in Eddy County, New Mexico described as:

Township 17 South, Range 28 East, NMPM  
Section 26: S/2

- 2) Extend the Artesia Pool in Eddy County, New Mexico to include therein:

Township 17 South, Range 28 East, NMPM  
Section 26: S/2

The Red Lake Pool produces from the Grayburg and San Andres formations and the Artesia Pool from the Queen, Grayburg and San Andres formations. There are currently no producing wells in this area, however, Western Development Company of Delaware plans to drill several wells in the area and has asked that this change in nomenclature be made.
