In behalf of Marathon Oil Company, application is hereby made for the drilling and completion of a well to be located in the Atoka Penn Gas Pool at a point 990 feet from the North line, and 990 feet from the East line, of N/E 1/4 of Section 30, Township 18 South, Range 26 East, Eddy County, New Mexico.

The applicant believes that this location for a well is necessary in order to recover a fair share of the gas, and that the granting of this application will not cause waste and is necessary for proper protection of correlative rights. It appears that this application cannot be granted administratively.

Gentlemen:

Hondo Oil & Gas Company owns an overriding royalty interest in Martin, Williams & Judson's #1 Hondo-LFE, Pennsylvania gas well located 990' from the South and East lines of Sec. 19, T-18-S, R-26-E, Eddy County, New Mexico.

Hondo objects to Marathon Oil Company's request to drill an unorthodox Pennsylvania gas test 990' from North and East Lines of Sec. 30, T-18-S, R-26-E, Eddy County, New Mexico.

Hondo is presenting this letter to evidence our objection at the time of subject hearing.

Hondo believes that since the requested location is contrary to field rules and in view of evidence previously heard pointing towards non-productivity of parts of the spacing unit this unorthodox location is not justified.

The requested location could, in our opinion, drain other acreage inequitably. The requested location, if granted, would warrant only partial allowable.



Gentlemen:

I have been informed that Marathon Oil Company has requested an unorthodox location 990' FNL and 990' FEL of Section 30, Township 18 South, Range 26 East, Eddy County, New Mexico.

I am the owner of the full mineral interest under the SE/4 of Section 19, Township 18 South, Range 26 East, and I feel that the location of this well, contrary to field rules, will have a detrimental effect upon the value of my mineral interest because of drainage of gas reserves which have been developed by the MWJ Hondo LFE #1. Due to the lenticular nature of the producing zone, this location might possibly result in the dedication of non-productive acreage to the proposed well. If this request for the unorthodox location is granted, and if Marathon Oil Company completes a producing well from the regular pay zone of the field, I feel that their allowable should be adjusted to protect my correlative rights.



Gentlemen:

This is to notify you of my objection to the proposed unorthodox location by Marathon Oil Company in the Northeast-quarter of Section 30-T18S-R26E, Eddy County, New Mexico.


I am one of the working interest owners under Martin, Williams & Judson's Hondo LFE No. 1 in the Southeast-quarter of Section 19-18-26. Our location was located and drilled according to established field rules calling for specific locations within a section. We would have liked to have drilled closer to established production than we did, but believing that field rules were meant to be followed, we accepted them and made no effort to improve our location.

I cannot understand Marathon's request other than as an effort to crowd established production and to drain our acreage. Evidently, they don't think an orthodox location will produce.

Whatever their reason, I feel that their proposed location would result in drainage from my well and impair my correlative rights. Consequently, I feel that they should follow established field rules just as Martin, Williams & Judson did in their well.

In the event their proposed location is granted I request that their allowable be adjusted, since otherwise, there is a strong chance that non-productive acreage will be dedicated to their well.



GENTLEMEN:

WHILE I OWN ONLY A SMALL INTEREST (1/8 W.I.) IN THE HONDO LEASE SOUTH OF THE ABOVE LOCATION, I WISH TO OBJECT TO THE APPLICATION OF MARATHON OIL COMPANY FOR A WELL LOCATION WHICH WILL BE CONTRARY TO THE ESTABLISHED FIELD RULES FOR THIS AREA.

AS YOU KNOW, THE PIPE LINE SERVING THE AREA IS UNABLE TO TAKE ALL THE GAS PRODUCED IN THE FIELD NOW AND MARATHON'S WELL WHICH WOULD CROWD OUR LEASE LINE COULD SERIOUSLY DRAIN OUR PROPERTY.

SINCE MARATHON WISHES TO MOVE THE LOCATION, IT OCCURS TO ME THAT THEY DO NOT THINK PART OF THEIR REGULAR SPACING WOULD BE PRODUCTIVE AND IF SUCH IS THE CASE THEN CERTAINLY IF THE UNUSUAL LOCATION IS GRANTED THEM THEIR ALLOWABLES SHOULD BE ADJUSTED DOWNWARD.
