APPLICATION OF BLACKWOOD & NICHOLS  
CO., LTD. FOR AN UNORTHODOX COAL GAS  
WELL LOCATION AND A NON-STANDARD GAS  
PRORATION UNIT, SAN JUAN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO

ORDER OF THE DIVISION

BY THE DIVISION:

This cause came on for hearing at 8:15 a.m. on March 1, 1989, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Victor T. Lyon.

NOW, on this 14th day of March, 1989, the Division Director, having considered the testimony, the record and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS THAT:

(1) Due public notice having been given as required by law, the Division has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) At the time of the hearing, Cases 9614, 9615 and 9616 were consolidated for purposes of testimony.

(3) The applicant, Blackwood & Nichols Co., Ltd., seeks approval of an unorthodox coal gas well location 930 feet from the South line and 610 feet from the West line (Unit N) of Irregular Section 6, Township 30 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, to test the Basin-Fruitland Coal (Gas) Pool, San Juan County, New Mexico.

(4) Lots 11, 12, 17 and 18 and the E/2 W/2 of Section 6, Township 30 North, Range 7 West, NMPM and Lots 11 and 12 and the E/2 SW/4 of Section 31, Township 31 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, are to be dedicated to the well forming a 296.02-acre non-standard gas spacing and proration unit for said pool.

(4) A well at an unorthodox location will enable the applicant to produce the coal gas underlying the proration unit, and the non-standard proration unit is necessary because of the irregular section along the west boundary of these townships, and was approved for Mesaverde gas production by Division Order No. R-751.

(5) No offset operator objected to the proposed unorthodox location or non-standard proration unit.

(6) Approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the coal gas in the affected pool, will prevent the economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:


(1) The application of Blackwood and Nichols Co., Ltd. for an unorthodox coal gas well location for the Basin-Fruitland Coal (Gas) Pool is hereby approved for a well to be located at a point 930 feet from the South line and 610 feet from the West line (Unit N) of Section 6, Township 30 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico.

(2) Lots 11, 12, 17 and 18 and the E/2 W/2 of Section 6, Township 30 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, and Lots 11 and 12 and the E/2 SW/4 of Section 31, Township 31 North, Range 7 West, NMPM, are to be dedicated to the well forming a 296.02-acre non-standard gas spacing and proration unit for said pool.


(3) Jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
