

Llano, Inc., a subsidiary of Hadson New Mexico, has become aware that Oryx Energy Company is proposing to drill a well to the Morrow formation at a location in the NW/4 of NW/4 Section 9, T22S R34E, Lea County, New Mexico.

Llano assumes that Oryx is aware that Llano, Inc.'s Grama Ridge Morrow gas storage project consists of Sections 33 and 34 of T21S, R39E and Sections 3, 4 and 10 of T22S, R34E, Lea County, New Mexico. The defined area is covered by existing formal agreements between Llano and the State of New Mexico, as well as Llano and the United States Government, which designate and unitize the Morrow formation for underground storage purposes.

Llano feels there is a possibility that the limits of the storage reservoir do extend into Section 9. Therefore, we solicit Oryx's cooperation in the exchange of current and future geological and reservoir information on your proposed well, only as this information relates directly to Llano's unitized Morrow gas storage interval. Should interpretation of this data indicate communication and, therefore, the presence of stored gas under Section 9, Llano requests your assistance in resolving the situation to our mutual satisfaction.
