A P P L I C A T I O N

COMES NOW ANADARKO PETROLEUM CORPORATION, by and through its attorneys, KELLAHIN, KELLAHIN & AUBREY, and in accordance with Section 70-2-17(c) N.M.S.A. (1978 Comp.) applies to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division for an order pooling all mineral interests from the top of the Wolfcamp formation to the base of the Pennsylvanian formation, including, but not limited to the Loco Hills South Morrow Pool, or 11,500 feet subsurface, whichever is deeper, underlying the W/2 Section 28, T17S, R30E, N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico. The above described acreage is to be dedicated to a well to be drilled at a standard location 2030 feet from the North line and 1830 feet from the West line of said section to a depth of approximately 11,500 feet. In support of this application, applicant would show:

1. Applicant has the right to drill and develop the W/2 of Section 28, T17S, R30E, Eddy County, New Mexico.
2. Applicant desires to drill a well at a standard location in the W/2 of said section.
3. Applicant has sought the voluntary agreement of the owners of the non-consenting working interests, for the formation of appropriate spacing and proration units, and has been able to obtain voluntary agreement with the exception of Union Texas Exploration Corporation.
4. Pursuant to the Division's notice requirements, applicant has notified all working interest owners of this application for compulsory pooling and the applicant's request that this matter be set for hearing before the Division on October 3, 1990.
5. In order to obtain its just and equitable share of the hydrocarbons underlying the above tract(s), applicant needs an order pooling the mineral interests involved in order to protect applicant's correlative rights and prevent waste.


WHEREFORE, Applicant prays that this application be set for hearing before the Division's duly appointed examiner, and that after notice and hearing as required by law, the Division enter its order pooling the mineral interests described herein. Applicant further prays that it be named



County Eddy Pool Loco Hills-Atoka Gas






