CROSS EXAMINATION

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1 9 BY MR. STAMETS: 2 Mr. Scott, you indicates that any -- any-3 thing that you can't recover will be going to Oil Processing 4 in Hobbs. 5 I wonder if you mean, what's the name of 6 that outfit, Pollution Control that has that big salt lake 7 disposal between Hobbs and Carlsbad? 8 You mean our iron sulfide? 9 0 Yeah. 10 Well now that's -- part of that's going Α We keep it all into a liquid. to be mixed up. 11 Uh-huh. 0 12 And Oil Processing is going to pick Α 13 the most of all of that. There will still be some hydrocar-14 bons in --15 MR. CLEMENTS: Well, there'll 16 be some things that old Persh won't want to buy off of you, 17 is what I'm saying, or what I mean. 18 Α Yes. MR. CLEMENTS: And this is the 19 only authorized place in --20 Α The rest of it that he doesn't take will 21 go to the disposal up there. 22 MR. CLEMENTS: And another 23 of course I've watched you build your dikes there a 24 couple of times going by, back and forth. 25 Α Yes.

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10 1 MR. CLEMENTS: You are 2 now that this is going to have to be kept in good shape be-3 cause it's setting on the very banks or brinks of what we 4 call Cedar Lake. 5 sir, we're about a half a mile from Yes, 6 it. 7 MR. CLEMENTS: And we've got 8 quite a water drain coming down off of the crest of these hills, too. 9 Yeah, we're fixing where our rainwater Α 10 and all, you know, that comes in will go around --11 MR. CLEMENTS: Right. 12 -- this, our proposed dike area. Α 13 Where is your good oil going to go? Q 14 It will go to Navajo. Α 15 0 Okay. And I presume you'll have a road 16 in across this dike. 17 Yes, sir. And you're going to have, what, a culvert 18 or something in there or you're --19 No. 20 -- going to have something so that Q it 21 won't get beat down. 22 Yeah, we'll have a road which will be 23 little taller there and it will be sloped on both 24 right here, where the trucks come in. 25 Now you indicated that you're just going Q

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to get oil from pits. You're not going to take oil from, like tank cleaning?

A Well now there's been several companies that have asked us if we would take tank bottoms after they, you know, as far as the cleaning of their tank bottoms, where now they have to pay to dispose of it, we -- we will take their tank bottoms.

Q Okay.

MR. STAMETS: Any other questions of the witness? I guess just one, that you are aware, I believe, from what you've said that you will not be allowed to put any -- any waste or any water in any pit or on the surface there except what you might need to keep everything neat --

A Yes, uh-huh, we --

Q -- and clean?

A -- don't -- we just use our water for our treating purpose and cleaning.

MR. STAMETS: Okay, any final questions? The witness may be excused.

Anything further in this case?

The case will be taken under advisement.
