APPLICATION

Comes now, DOYLE HARTMAN, by his undersigned attorneys, and hereby makes application to the Oil Conservation Division for approval of a non-standard proration unit, two unorthodox infill well locations and simultaneous dedication in the Jalmat Gas Pool and the Langlie Mattix Pool, Lea County, New Mexico, and in support thereof respectfully states:

1. Applicant is the operator and owns or has obtained voluntary agreement with or obtained a farmout from all working interest owners in and under the W/2 SW/4 of Section 22, and the NW/4 of Section 27, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico.

2. Applicant seeks the establishment of a 240-acre non-standard proration unit to be comprised of the above-described acreage in the Jalmat Gas Pool to be dedicated to his Carlson-Harrison Federal Com. Well No. 4 to be drilled at an unorthodox location at least 1,325 feet from the South line but no more than 1,650 feet from the South line, and at least 660

feet from the West line but no more than 850 feet from the West line of Section 22, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico.

3. Applicant also seeks authority, if the proposed Carlson-Federal Com. Well No. 4 does not effectively and efficiently drain the proration unit in the Jalmat Gas Pool, to locate his proposed Carlson-Harrison Federal Com. Well No. 5 at an optional second unorthodox location at least 250 feet from the North line but no more than 900 feet from the North line, and at least 660 feet from the West line but no more than 1980 feet from the West line of Section 27, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico.

4. Applicant further seeks approval to simultaneously dedicate the above-described 240-acre non-standard proration unit to its Carlson-Harrison Federal Com. Well No. 4 and its Carlson-Harrison Federal Com. Well No. 5, if necessary, and the existing Carlson-Harrison Federal Com. Wells Nos. 1, 2 and 3.


5. The approval of this application will afford applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas from the Jalmat Gas Pool and the Langlie Mattix Pool and will otherwise be in the best interest of conservation, the protection of correlative rights, and the prevention of waste.

WHEREFORE, Doyle Hartman requests that this application be set for hearing before a duly appointed Examiner of the Oil Conservation Division on August 28, 1985, that notice be given as required by law and the rules of the Division, and that the Division enter its Order granting this application.
