3 1 2 MR. STOGNER: This hearing will 3 come to order. 4 We'll call Case Number 8880. 5 MR. TAYLOR: The application of Dwight Crawford, doing business as Crawford Treating Com-6 7 pany, for an oil treating plant permit, Lea County, New Mex-8 ico. 9 MR. STOGNER: Call for appear-10 ances. 11 MR. LEACH: I'm Dewey B. Leach, attorney, Hobbs, New Mexico, representing Dwight Crawford, 12 doing business as Crawford Treating Company, and we're here 13 to offer the evidence that we are now -- have our plans. 14 15 We've attached to our applica-16 tion a survey, and also a diagram of hte facilities that 17 will be constructed thereon as Exhibit B, and I have also a 18 letter from Mr. Jerry Sexton, who perhaps, I think, sent a 19 copy to the Commission of the original letter that I will 20 introduce in evidence that he has inspected the premises and 21 what is being erected there for the treating operation and 22 he feels that it's satisfactory in every respect. 23 And I'd like to call Dwight 24 Crawford as the first witness, please. Would you stand and 25 be sworn?

4 1 MR. TAYLOR: Do you have any 2 other witnesses at this point? 3 MR. LEACH: No, just him. 4 MR. STOGNER: Are there any 5 other appearances? Will the witness please stand? 6 7 (Witness sworn.) 8 9 MR. LEACH: Thank you. 10 11 DWIGHT CRAWFORD, 12 being called as a witness and being duly sworn upon his 13 oath, testified as follows, to-wit: 14 15 DIRECT EXAMINATION 16 BY MR. LEACH: 17 Q State your name, please. 18 Α Bobby Dwight Crawford. 19 Q And, Mr. Crawford, you have made applica-20 tion for an oil treating permit on properties in Lea County, 21 New Mexico, is that correct? 22 Α Yes. 23 0 Tell the Commission here what you have 24 proposed and what your operation is going to consist of. 25 Α Yes, sir, I'll be receiving waste oil,

5 1 tank bottoms, pit oil, disposal system skim oil, the treat-2 ment and disposing of waste at Parabo public disposal facil-3 ity, about six miles from my plant, and be selling the 4 crude. 5 Q Now, what -- where is this located, 6 please? 7 Α This will be six miles south of Hobbs and 8 ten miles to the east off Highway 18. 9 Q Then it's some two miles off the highway. 10 Α Yes, sir. 11 Q And is there any residency in that area? 12 Α No, sir, not within a mile. 13 I'll hand you an exhibit that I will of-0 14 Tell me what that is, please. fer. 15 Α Yes, sir. That's a letter from, I would 16 from Jerry Sexton, saying that he had gone with me and say, 17 approved the site. 18 Now, on the -- you're required to produce 0 19 a bond for this operation, which is a performance bond, I 20 believe, and have you made inquiry as to your ability to ob-21 tain a bond? 22 Α sir. I'm dealing with Daniels In-Yes, 23 surance and have given them my financial statement and they 24 said my bond will be received within -- within the week. 25 And it's in the amount of \$10,000. 0

6 1 Yes, sir, \$10,000 performance bond. Α 2 And I really have no other questions, as 0 3 far as I would know. 4 MR. LEACH: Do we have any 5 questions by the Commission? 6 MR. STOGNER: Yes, I do. 7 8 CROSS EXAMINATION 9 BY MR. STOGNER: 10 Q Mr. Crawford. 11 Α Yes. 12 Q I have here a letter from you, it looks 13 like dated April 1st, 1986. 14 Α Yes, sir. 15 0 This is the application for the oil 16 treating plant permit? 17 Α Yes, sir. 18 Q Okay, and in that you showed a survey. 19 Yes, sir. Α 20 Okay, let's refer to that survey here. 0 21 I've got a copy of it here on that application that you sub-22 mitted --23 Α Okay. 24 -- in which you show 40.09 acres --0 25 Yes, sir. Α

7 1 0 -- in Section 12, and then you show the 2 treating plant location essentially up in the northeast 3 quarter of that 40 acres. 4 Α Yes, sir. 5 Is that the actual pad? 0 6 Α Yes, sir. 7 How many acres does that pad cover? 0 8 Α The pad will be 150 foot by 150 foot. 9 Q Will there be a firewall around this pad? 10 A Yes, sir, I've already constructed it and 11 there is a firewall. 12 Q Would you go into a little more detail? 13 Α Well, we have, what it was, we had about 14 six inches of sand on top of a caliche subgrade and we took 15 all of the -- skimmed off all the sand and built a dike com-16 pletely around the location. 17 0 Out of the sand that was on the pad. 18 Α Yes. 19 Q Okay, could you give me the dimensions on 20 that firewall? 21 Yes, sir, it would be 18 inches in height Ά 22 by 150 by 150; 150 wide by 150 long. 23 Q Okay, now is this dike large enough to 24 contain --25 Yes, and my total volume is 2400 barrels Α

8 1 and that dike should hold well above 2400 barrels. I can't 2 remember my exact figures but it was like 4 or 5000 barrels 3 it would be safely holding. 4 What's the maximum amount of waste or oil Q 5 that you plan to treat in a day? 6 In a day? Α 7 0 Uh-huh. 8 It would be -- if, saying that oil Α was 9 already in the plant, I'll be treating gross barrelwise, 500 10 barrels in a day, depending on how much BS & W is in it, the 11 net oil sold would vary according to materials I receive. 12 So all things being equal, probably 500 Q 13 barrels of oil per day maximum? 14 Yes, sir, it would be maximum. Α 15 0 This pad that sets on this 40 acres, is 16 that 40 acres State, Federal, or fee land? 17 Α It is my land, it's deeded land. 18 How long have you had this land? Q 19 Α For approximately two months, I quess. 20 I'd have to look back to tell you. 21 Okay, let's refer to what you show as At-0 22 tachment B on that application and you show some sort of a 23 schematic here, with waste tanks --24 Yes, sir. Α 25 Q -- heater/treater, bleeding tank (sic).

1 Would you please kind of elaborate on it? 2 Α Yes, sir. In my treater tanks is where 3 I'll unload the waste materials and I'll circulate the waste 4 through my heating system. It will be coming off the bottom 5 of my treaters and coming through the heating system and 6 then back over the top into my treating tanks, and after it 7 settles out I'll be pumping the bottoms off into my waste 8 tank and skimming the crude over into my sales tanks. 9 And the blending tank will be if I have some real high gravity oil, I can -- I'll use that to adjust 10 11 gravity on my crude. And from the waste tank I'll be checking 12 13 the waste materials from the waste tank. 14 0 And as you mentioned in your testimony they will be going to Parabo? 15 16 Α Yes, sir. 17 Q Are they -- are they licensed to handle 18 such waste --19 Α Yes, sir. 20 0 -- that will be coming out of your waste 21 tank? 22 A Yes, sir, they are. They handle all 23 sites 24 Will any chemicals be used in this pro-Q 25 cess?

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10 1 No, sir. Α 2 Q Okay. 3 Α Can I make an adjustment on that? 4 Usually, every now and then I might have to use chemicals 5 but on the normal everyday usage I won't have any. 6 When will you be needing 0 to use 7 chemicals, do you --8 Α When I -- when I run into some -- some 9 kind of materials that are real hard to treat and knock the 10 BS & W out of. This was -- these are very, very rare 11 situations; and most times brine and heat takes care of anything. 12 13 0 What sort of things would come in that 14 you would need to use chemicals? When would foresee this? 15 Α Where it would aid in speeding the 16 treating of the oil, like if it was real heavy ion content 17 oil it might help in go ahead and making it fall out easier 18 and not having to retreat it again. 19 What kind of chemicals would be used on 0 20 something like that? 21 Α In a situation like that I would have to 22 call a chemical company and have them help me with an analy-23 sis on the problem. 24 0 Now this layout that you show on this At-25 tachment B, is that the way it will be laid out on the --

11 ١ sir, I called one -- last week Α No, and 2 talked to Mr. Catanach, is that right? 3 Yes. Q 4 And explained to him that instead of us-Α 5 ing the two 210 sales tanks I was going to use one 500 bar-6 rel sales tank, and he said that that would -- I could just 7 bring that up to you all, that that would be no problem. 8 Is that the only adjustment? 0 9 Α Yes, sir. 10 Q What kind of security will be provided 11 for this operation? 12 Α What kind of security? You mean in 13 respect to the bond? 14 0 No, security as far as will there be а 15 fence around it? Is there --16 Α Oh. 17 -- somebody out there on location? Q 18 Α There will be a fence built and there 19 will be some people living approximately 1000 foot from the 20 location. 21 This living quarters, I thought you said 0 22 that there ws no residence within a mile. 23 Α Well, what I'm saying is a man has 24 offered to stay out at my place at nights if I would let him 25 stay out there, and that's the situation; just kind of as a

12 1 -- I'll let him stay out there if he can watch over my place 2 at night. 3 So there would be a man on 24-hour watch? 0 4 Α I would be there during the day and he'd 5 be there at night. 6 0 Would there be any unlined pits or any 7 pits on the location? 8 Α No, sir, no pits at all. 9 MR. STOGNER: I have no further 10 questions of Mr. Crawford. 11 Are there any other questions 12 of this witness? 13 If not, he may be excused. 14 Mr. Leach, do you have anything 15 further in Case Number 8880? 16 MR. LEACH: No, sir, I have no-17 thing further except we feel that we're conforming with the 18 requirements of the Commission in the operation and we plan 19 to do so, and I understand that Pat Cargill, the agent with 20 Daniels Insurance, has indicated we will have the bond, the 21 \$10,000 bond, within a week. She has to get the home office 22 approval but she thinks it is tentatively granted. 23 MR. STOGNER: Is there anything 24 further in Case Number 8880? 25 Let's see, Mr. Leach, I believe

13 you wish to offer Exhibit Number One at this time? 1 MR. LEACH: Yes, yes, sir, I 2 would, please. 3 MR. STOGNER: All right, 4 I'd like to take administrative notice of the application which 5 shows the schematic and the survey at this time, also, and 6 that's attached to a letter from Mr. Crawford to us, dated 7 April 1st, 1986. 8 Is there anything further 9 in this case? 10 MR. LEACH: That is all we 11 have. 12 MR. STOGNER: If not, Case Num-13 ber 8880 will be taken under advisement. 14 15 (Hearing concluded.) 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25
