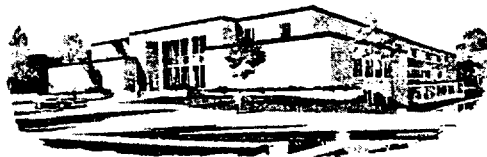

Pursuant to Section 70-2-8 N.M.S.A. (1978) and New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Rule 1211, Applicant Texaco Producing, Inc. requests the production of the following documents for inspection and copying at the offices of Campbell and Black, P.A., 110 North Guadalupe, Suite 1, Jefferson Place, (P.O. Box 2208), Santa Fe, New Mexico 87504-2208 at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, June 5, 1987.

As used herein the term "document" means all written recorded or graphic material of every type and description, in whatever form, however produced or reproduced, including but not limited to, all original and all non-identical duplicates, copies or reproductions thereof, memoranda, agreements, contracts, letters of intent, maps, charts, credit reports, telex, cables, wires, telecopies, notes, notations, work papers, desk calendars, appointment journals, diaries, reports, recordings of telephone or other conversations or of interviews, conferences or meetings,

ledgers, notebooks, bank records, drafts, checks, negotiable or non-negotiable instruments, leases, credit files, books of account, data compilations, affidavits, notices, microfilm, dictation, records, tape recordings, cassette recordings, photographs, films, video tapes or cassettes, software or floppy disks or diskettes, computer storage materials including magnetic tapes, computer materials, purchase agreements or contracts, invoices, purchase orders, statements, monthly or annual reports of condition, and any notes, annotations, jotting, scribbings, file or routing marks or other indications added to any such document, and any drafts, preliminary versions, revisions, corrections and amendments thereof.

REQUEST NO. 1: All potash core assay information evidencing the thickness and quality of potash reserves underlying Section 16 and adjoining sections in Township 23 South, Range 30 East, N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico.

REQUEST NO. 2: All documents evidencing the volumes of potash reserves in the areas identified in Request No. 1 above that you contend will be lost if Texaco drills its two wells at the proposed locations in Section 16, Township 23 South, Range 30 East, N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico.

REQUEST NO. 3: All documents supporting your contentions that the value of potash reserves potentially lost will be between two million dollars and eight million dollars.


REQUEST NO. 4: All documents evidencing your right to mine in Section 16, Township 23 South, Range 30 East, N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico, including but not limited to, leases, assignments, farmouts, operating agreements and all governmental approvals.

REQUEST NO. 5: All documents and maps evidencing your mining plans for the last ten years, all future mining plans and areas actually mined and/or developed.

REQUEST NO. 6: All documents demonstrating how you define or otherwise distinguish "barren" potash areas from commercial potash areas.

MINUTES OF THE ARBITRATION MEETING
HELD ON MAY 29, 1987

An arbitration meeting to discuss the drilling of the Texaco Producing Inc. Forty-Niner Ridge Unit Well No. 3 in Section 16, Township 23 South, Range 30 East, Potash-Oil Area, was held on Friday, May 29, 1987, at 9 o'clock a.m. in Room 205, State Land Office Building, Santa Fe, New Mexico. The meeting was conducted by William J. LeMay, Director of the Oil Conservation Division, and Victor T. Lyon, Chief Engineer of the Oil Conservation Division. An attendance sheet is attached.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. LeMay at 9 o'clock a.m. Scott Hall, representing Texaco Producing Inc., stated that the proposed location is in a barren area and the State Land Office has approved the well as part of a state unit. He said that Texaco is faced with having some of this land removed from the participating area of the unit or the possible loss of the leases altogether if a well is not drilled. John L. Seeman with Texaco stated that the original location, 2310 feet from the North and East lines of said Section 16, was arbitrated in 1986 and, at that time, the potash people indicated they would not object if the location was moved north and west. He, therefore, was under the impression that this proposed location, 2310 feet from the North line and 1980 feet from the West line, would be acceptable. He stated that the proposed well will be drilled to the Cherry Canyon formation. Russell Pool with Texaco presented geologic information and explained his interpretation of the structure underlying the proposed well.


Charles High, representing the potash group, told of the last arbitration meeting at which Texaco was told there would be no objection to its well if it was moved to the north and west into the barren area at a distance equal to the depth of the ore plus ten percent. He stated that the proposed new location will waste between two and eight million dollars of potash. He suggested that an acceptable location would be in the vicinity of the Skelly well. He estimated the depth of the potash to be 1200 feet. He explained first and second potash mining and the subsidence of the earth. Directional drilling was discussed as a possible method of developing the oil and gas lease but Texaco was opposed to this method because of the additional costs involved. It was pointed out that if the proposed well proves out, Texaco plans to drill 64 more in the unit. Mr. High assured that the potash will be mined eventually no matter how long it takes and the potash industry believes mining is dangerous if an oil or gas well has been drilled in the area. Mr. Seeman requested that Texaco be furnished the tonnage number of the potash that will be wasted from the drilling of this well. The possibility of migration of oil and methane gas into the potash mines was discussed.

An alternative location of 1650 feet from the North and West lines of said Section 16 was suggested and discussed. Texaco is not willing to move to this location because of additional costs required to build roads to accommodate a different location and the location is farther away from the pay. No agreement was reached.

Mr. High requested a continuance of Texaco's application covering the original location which was set for the examiner hearing on June 3, 1987. It was agreed that said application will be continued to a Commission hearing scheduled for June 18 and consolidated with an application for the subject location.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:30 a.m.

In planning the Commission hearing scheduled for June 18, 1987, it has become clear to me that some pre-hearing agreement may be necessary in order to expedite the hearing process through limitation of repetitive or cumulative testimony and stipulation of facts. Dear Russ:

This will confirm our telephone conversation today during which I informed you that the Potash Industry would not oppose your Company's drilling of the above-referenced well provided it is relocated to the barren area north and west of the currently proposed site and drilled from a surface location which is a distance away from commercial grade ore equal to the depth of the ore plus 10% plus whatever additional distance your company believes is necessary to prevent any migration of methane gas into our mine in the event of a leak.

When you have made the determination on this new location, I would appreciate your letting me know the exact location. We will then plot the location on our maps and let you know our position. As stated above, if the new location meets the guidelines set forth above, we will have no opposition to the new location. This is true even if, as you suggested, you want to drill three or four wells.

I appreciate your cooperation with this matter and I look forward to hearing from you.



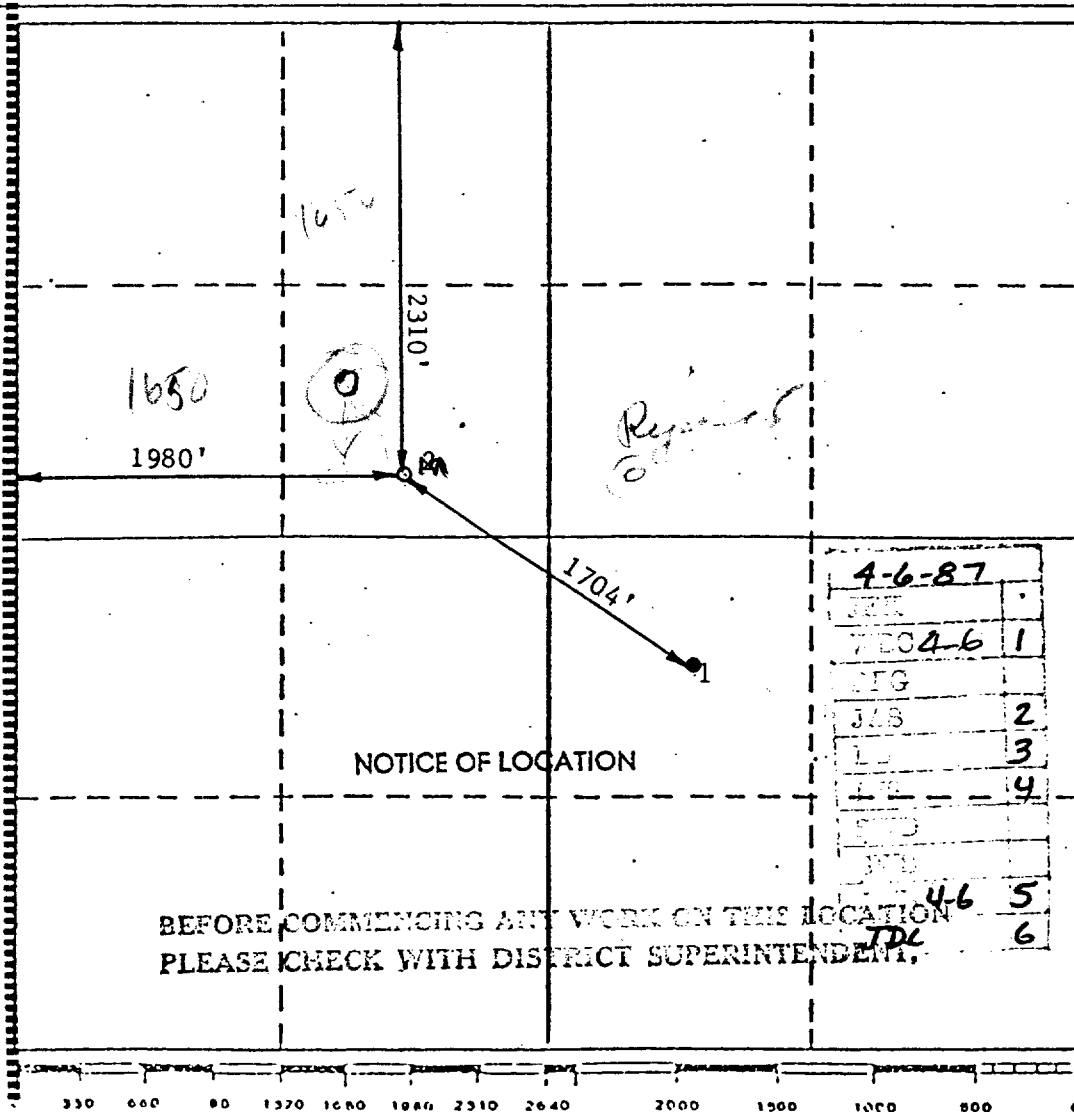


