



Dear Sirs:

The above described exception location is being requested by Marshall Pipe and Supply Company, as operator of the Tule Field. NICOR Exploration Company is a working interest owner in the other Tule Field producers as well as in the proposed exception location. NICOR Exploration is in favor of drilling at the exception location and feels that this location will optimize efficient drainage of the Montoya Reservoir thought to be present in the N/2 of Section 34. A combination of a major down-to-the-west normal fault located 600' west of the proposed location and steep easterly dip to the east of the proposed location preclude drilling a geologically favorable standard location in accordance with Commission rules.

Therefore, NICOR Exploration respectfully requests relief from standard spacing guidelines by administrative approval from the Commission for drilling the #1 Cook at the above-requested exception location.

GEOLOGICAL CONDITIONS
FOR
UNORTHODOX LOCATION
OF THE
MARSHALL PIPE AND SUPPLY - COOK #1
330' FNL & 1980' FEL, Section 34-2S-29E

Marshall Pipe and Supply respectfully requests administrative approval for the unorthodox location of its proposed Cook #1 to be drilled 330 feet from the North line and 1980 feet from the East line of Section 34, Township 2 South, Range 29 East, Roosevelt County, New Mexico. The north half of section 34 would be dedicated to the well.

The necessity for this unorthodox location is based upon geological conditions.

Exhibit #1 is a land plat showing the proposed location and its relationship to the surrounding acreage in which Marshall Pipe and Supply has full or partial operating rights. The proration unit is outlined in red.

Exhibit #2 is a map depicting the subsurface structure on top of the Pre-Penn unconformity. The contour interval is 50'. Datum points are noted by circles and the appropriate datum is listed. Well spots colored in red indicate Ordovician producers. The red outline marks the termination of the Mississippian formation. Pertinent seismic lines are marked in green.

The structure map shows a north-northeast, south-southwest trending horst block which is fault bounded to the east, west and south. Throw on the bounding faults is probably about 200' feet. Lack of well control on the down thrown side of the faults makes depth conversions from time values difficult.


Closure into the west fault provides the trapping mechanism. Porosity and permeability are enhanced in the Ordovician reservoir as erosion has completely stripped away the Mississippian sediments providing an opportunity for the Ordovician dolomite to be exposed subaerially and develop Karst topography. The overlying Pennsylvanian section provides the source for hydrocarbons.

The approximate gas/water contact is -2700 as tested by the Speight #1 in Section 22-T2S-R29E.


As the subcrop of the Mississippian does not coincide with the Pre-Penn structure exactly, it is felt that this structure was later tilted downward to the south-southeast. Therefore a location to the south-southeast of the current structure should have been located on the paleo-high and should have excellent porosity and permeability. It is also possible that the gas/water contact is tilted and would be found at a lower datum in that direction.

In summary, the proposed unorthodox location is the best allowable location in the north half of Section 34 which would enable the borehole to encounter the structure at its highest point possible and not cross a bounding fault. It is anticipated that structurally high penetration of the Ordovician would enhance earlier and greater recovery of gas reserves. The well will be drilled through to the Precambrian to ensure that the complete section is tested. It is believed that approval of this location would prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

The above discussion of geological conditions and Exhibits #1 and #2 were prepared by Leslie Bentz. Leslie Bentz is employed by Yates Petroleum Corporation as a geologist in Artesia, New Mexico. She has testified before and been approved as an expert witness by the Oil Conservation Division of the State of New Mexico.






