
Our firm represents Amoco Production Company which is opposed to the above referenced hardship gas well application.

Amoco Production Company is an affected party in that it operates gas wells in the same pool and is connected to the same gas gathering system operated by El Paso Natural Gas Company.

The granting of a hardship well classification to the Doyle Hartman well will allow Mr. Hartman priority access to the same pipeline and thereby reduce the pipeline takes from the Amoco wells. Accordingly, Amoco's correlative rights are affected by this case.

Pursuant to Rule 410 B. (3) of Oil Commission Order R-7453, Amoco Production Company requests that the Commission continue case 8226 and require Mr. Hartman to run a log-off test on the subject well prior to hearing.
