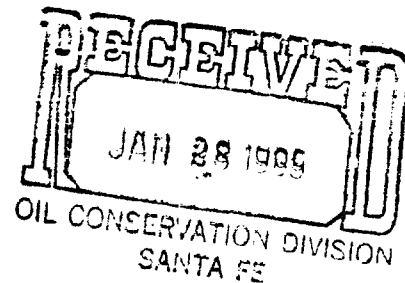


Dear Mr. Taylor:

We are in receipt of your Docket No. 4-85 in which, among other things, the above cases are noticed for hearing on January 30, 1985. First, the PSC moves that it be allowed to intervene as an interested party in the above cases. Mr. Charles F. Noble and myself will be the attorneys of record for the PSC.

Second, the PSC objects to the granting of the exemptions sought by Damson Oil. As your notice for these cases says, "To be considered will be the granting of said exemption from the date of the filing of the application." The applications for these wells were filed on December 10, 1984. Any exemption from the New Mexico Natural Gas Pricing Act (NMPA) would therefore have to be granted from that date forward. However, the NMPA, having expired on July 1, 1984, was not even in effect as of the application date. Thus, the applications are moot because there are no exemptions or other relief which can lawfully be granted.

For these reasons, the PSC respectfully requests the OCC to declare the above applications moot and to dismiss them from its docket.

**PROPOSED ORDER OF THE DIVISION**

**BY THE COMMISSION:**

This cause came on for hearing on March 27 and April 10, 1985, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before the Oil Conservation Division of New Mexico, hereinafter referred to as the "Division", Michael E. Stogner, Examiner.

NOW, on this \_\_\_\_\_ day of April, 1985, the Division Director having considered the testimony, and the exhibits received at said hearing, and being fully advised in the premises,

**FINDS:**

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Division has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That the Applicant, Damson Oil Corporation, is a working interest owner in the Mexico Federal K No. 1E and Getty Oil Co. is the operator of the Mexico Federal K No. 1E, which is subject to the New Mexico Natural Gas Pricing Act, hereinafter referred to as the "Act" and on February 6, 1985, filed an application seeking exemption from the pricing provisions of the Act for said well.

(3) That Damson Oil Corporation's production from said well is sold in intrastate commerce.

(4) Said Act applies to any well drilled after January 1, 1975, if it was drilled on an established proration unit which was producing gas or was capable of producing gas from the same reservoir prior to January 1, 1975, unless the Oil Conservation Division exempts such well upon a finding that the drilling of the well was justified for reasons other than avoiding the application of the Act.

(5) Commission Order No. R-1670-V authorized a second well on an established gas proration and drilling unit in the Basin-Dakota Pool, with findings that infill wells were necessary to recover additional gas from that pool.

(6) Since the drilling of the second well on the proration unit for that well, the Applicant has done nothing to restrict the ability of the original well on each of the gas proration and drilling units to produce into the pipeline.

(7) That the Mexico Federal K No. 1E was drilled for reasons other than avoiding the New Mexico Pricing Act.

(8) Granting an exemption from the date of first production from this well will not impair correlative rights nor cause waste.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

(1) Commencing October 26, 1979, an exemption from the provisions of the New Mexico Natural Gas Pricing Act is hereby granted to the Mexico Federal K No. 1E to the extent that gas from said well is sold in intrastate commerce.

(2) Jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.


Dear Mike:

JUDGMENT

This matter having come before the Court for hearing on a Motion for Summary Judgment filed by Certain Producer-Defendants, and joined in by all Producer-Defendants, and by Plaintiffs, and the Court having fully considered the memoranda filed by counsel, the pleadings, affidavits and exhibits, and the arguments and authorities of counsel, the Court enters its Judgment as follows:

A. For all infill wells owned or operated by Producer-Defendants which were drilled in the Blanco Mesa Verde Reservoir in San Juan and Rio Arriba Counties, New Mexico, after the entry of Oil Conservation Commission Order No. R-1670-T (November 14,

1974) and for all infill wells owned or operated by Producer-Defendants which were drilled in the Basin Dakota Reservoir in San Juan and Rio Arriba Counties, New Mexico, after the entry of Oil Conservation Commission Order No. R-1670-V (May 22, 1979), the Court concludes:

(1) The pleadings, depositions, answers to interrogatories, admissions and affidavits and exhibits show that there is no genuine issue as to any material fact with respect to whether such wells are exempt from the pricing provisions of the New Mexico Natural Gas Pricing Act, § 62-7-5, N.M.S.A. 1978 (repealed).

(2) The moving parties are entitled to summary judgment under Rule 56 of the New Mexico Rules of Civil Procedure as a matter of law with respect to the question of whether such wells are exempt from the pricing provisions of the New Mexico Natural Gas Pricing Act § 62-7-5 because the Oil Conservation Commission found that such wells were drilled for conservation purposes to increase natural gas supply and, accordingly, were justified for reasons other than avoiding the pricing provisions of the New Mexico Natural Gas Pricing Act. This finding applies to the wells identified in Exhibit "A," attached hereto, which the Oil Conservation Commission found to be exempt in well-by-well proceedings.

(3) The Motion for Summary Judgment filed by Certain Producer-Defendants and joined in by all Producer-Defendants

and by Plaintiffs is granted, and the Counterclaims and Cross-claims of the Attorney General for the State of New Mexico, and all claims of Plaintiffs against Producer-Defendants, are dismissed with prejudice because such wells were and are exempt from application of the New Mexico Natural Gas Pricing Act.

(4) The bonds required to be filed with the Court by the Court's Order of Interpleader dated April 18, 1984 for these wells are no longer necessary since refunds are not owed and all bonds filed with the Court for such wells are released and dissolved.

(5) Plaintiffs are hereby ordered to pay to Producer-Defendants, within forty-five (45) days from the entry of this Judgment, any and all payments still withheld by Plaintiffs from certain Producer-Defendants for the production months of January, 1984 through June, 1984. Interest shall be paid on withheld sums, whether previously or presently withheld, at the rate of 9-3/4%, calculated on sums withheld from the date of withholding until the day of payment.

(6) With respect to the wells identified in Exhibit "A," the Court's judgment is a final judgment based upon the Court's express determination that there is no just reason for delay.

B. For all other infill wells which were drilled in the above-noted reservoirs, the Court stays further action in this case pending a determination by the Oil Conservation Commission

whether such wells were justified for reasons other than avoiding application of the Natural Gas Pricing Act. Upon a finding by the Oil Conservation Commission that such wells were justified for reasons other than avoiding the Pricing Act, the stay referred to above shall be lifted upon application of any party, and an order consistent with this ruling will be entered for all such wells. Upon a contrary finding by the Oil Conservation Commission, the stay referred to above shall be lifted upon application by any party, and this action may proceed with respect to such wells. The Court retains such further jurisdiction over those wells as may be necessary for the completion of this matter.


C. Each party shall bear its own costs of this proceeding.


