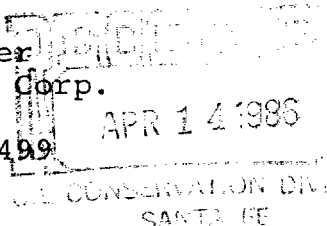

Dear Mr. McCallister:

You are hereby granted an emergency hardship classification for the referenced well. This classification will expire on July 9, 1986.

We have forwarded your application to Santa Fe to be docketed for hearing for two reasons:

- 1) The application states that there is significant water production from the well. No water has ever been reported on form C-115. This needs to be explained.
- 2) Your projected loss of reserves due to shut-in is based on only one month of production after extended shut-in. Previous shut-ins did not result in loss of reserves, and experience in this area shows that some wells eventually recover from extended shut-ins.
