The text of this letter is a follow up to the referenced hearing that was conducted on Wednesday, October 21, 1987. It concerns the question raised as to the possible relationship of the producing Lower Atoka sand in the recently completed Petrus Oil Company Henshaw Federal #1 (Section 14, 16S-30E) and the producing gas sand in the Little Lucky Lake Field 4-1/2 miles to the north.

From a log standpoint, both sand zones are in the base of the Atoka and by interval appear to be correlative. From a time depositional standpoint, the sand at Little Lucky Lake was probably deposited at approximately the same time as in the Henshaw area which is further basinward. Migration into these sands would probably have been simultaneous so the hydrocarbon characteristics should be the same. There are no wells deep enough between Little Lucky Lake and the Henshaw well that have penetrated the Atoka section, but we know that the reservoir sand in question is not a blanket sand covering the entire area. This is evidenced by 16 other wells within a 10 mile radius of the two producing areas not having the sand developed. development drilling at Little Lucky Lake has been restricted by loss of sand on the flanks of the field, especially to the south, which indicates deposition was not continuous.

The depositional environment of the Atoka sand was probably deltaic and in the form of offshore bars. Isopacheous mapping of the sand in the two areas indicates a NE-SW alignment to the interpreted bars which puts them in a staggered or offset position rather than in a continuous depositional trend which would indicate separation as bar sands do not normally meander that much. The hydrocarbon trapping mechanism in both producing areas is interpreted to be a draping of the sand bodies over deeper structure which is much in evidence at Little Lucky Lake and under the Henshaw Federal #1. Both of these mapped structures are isolated.

In conclusion, I feel there is sufficient evidence, based on a study of the overall area, to indicate the producing sand in question is not a continuous reservoir.


