Dear Mr. Stephens:

In accordance with my agreement with your secretary whom I have just conversed with over the telephone, I am sending you the necessary forms on which to complete the reports on the above captioned well.

The C-101 is necessary in view of the fact that there was a misunderstanding to the effect that Mr. Tom Gordon signed the original C-101, as your agent. It will be necessary for you to sign as agent for the operators.

The C-102 is the notice of intention to perform some operation on a well and should precede actual work. The C-103 is a report of the work accomplished and should be submitted immediately after the work is done. This means that this procedure should be followed for the setting of casing, whipstocking, drillstem tests, etc.

I also requested that samples be submitted to us down to at least 100 feet below the point at which surface casing was set. We should also be informed as to the water zones encountered.

If you are drilling this well "tight" you may be assured that such information be kept confidential for any reasonable period. I am sure that you will agree that we can not do our job without a reasonable amount of specific information.

I am contemplating an inspection tour of this area this coming Monday and Tuesday and I will expect to be allowed on the rig floor upon presentation of my identification card. This is signed by all three members of the Oil Conservation Commission.
