Gentlemen:

We have on file Form C-101, Notice of Intention to Drill, for J. C. Lee Drilling Co. Well No. 1-A, Section 30, Township 9 North, Range 32 East, Quay County, New Mexico, approved January 14, 1960. No further information on this well has been received by this office since that date.

If drilling operations commenced on the well, we will require Commission Forms C-102 and C-103, showing spudding date, and progress of drilling operations, casing set, amount of cement needed, and depths of casing, along with total depth.

Rule 202 Section (c) of the Commission's Rules and Regulations states: "When drilling operations have been suspended for 60 days, the well shall be plugged and abandoned unless a permit for temporary abandonment shall be obtained from the Commission." This will apply if the well was spudded and abandoned. If the well was never spudded, Form C-103 should be filed to show an abandoned location.
