RE: San Miguel and Harding Counties, New Mexico Abandoned Wells

Dear Ms. Kemp:

Your letter and note regarding the Trigg Well No. 3 (J-25-15N-28E) is received with appreciation. It is obviously the duty of CO_-In-Action to file the overdue reports and attend to the location.

Another well which needs attention is one drilled by CO₂-In-Action, being the Upton Well No. 1 (D-25-18N-26E). According to the reports filed with this Agency, this well was taken over by Texas Pacific Oil Company and later acquired by your company. The name changes are all in order, unless this well has also been transferred since January 12, 1982. In this case, no Form C-105 has been received since Texas Pacific submitted a Well Completion Report on Form C-103, dated June 24, 1980. According to that report, the well was completed as a producer and shut-in.

Because no official completion (C-105) was reported, and no request for temporary abandonment has been received, it is incumbent upon the Oil Conservation Division to request some additional information. If well is to be held as a Shut-in gas well, a completed Form C-105 should be submitted and a request made for permission to Temporarily Abandon. (See Rule 202 B.) If Sun is not the owner of this property, we would appreciate such information also.

A similar situation to the above discussed Upton Well, concerns the Trujillo Well No. 1 (A-23-18N-28E) in Harding County. The history and well file condition is very similar, except in this latter case the Form C-103 from Texas Pacific indicates the final completion was not made.

Your assistance in updating or closing our files pertaining to the above is appreciated.
