Gentlemen:

Enclosed are a book of New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission rules and regulations, along with various forms which you will need to file for the drilling of a well in New Mexico. We are also enclosing a \$5000 one-well bond form as well as \$10,000 blanket bond forms. If you wish to cover only one well please have executed the \$5000 bond form. If you anticipate further operations it might be advantageous to use the \$10,000 blanket bond which would cover plugging operations on all future wells.

As I understand it, you propose to drill a well on Fee land in San Miguel County. You should proceed as follows:

After your bond has been approved by the Commission, Notice of Intention to Drill should be filed in quintuplicate, along with copies of Form C-128, Well Location and Acreage Dedication Plat. The well location should be made and certified to by a registered land surveyor. The proper acreage dedication in this case would probably be 40 acres.

Form C-103, Miscellaneous Notices, are used for the purpose of reporting casing tests, artificial stimulation or any operations performed on the well. Form C-105, Well Record, is filed after the completion of the well and all pertinent information should be filled out as indicated. All the above information should be filed with the Oil Conservation Commission, Box 871, Santa Fe, N.M., as that is the District office for San Miguel County. If production is secured, please contact the Santa Fe Office for further instructions. If you wish to abandon the well plugging instructions should also be secured from Santa Fe prior to abandonment.
