### Firm Seeks Oil-Drilling OK

SANTA FE — A Tulsa, Okla. corporation will request permission tonight from a county panel to drill as deep as 7,000 feet in search of oil near NM 14 south of Santa Fe.

Continental Crude Corp. "feels pretty confident there's something down there," said Richard Gorman, county and use administrator. The proposed test site is about 3.5 miles south of the State Penitentiary and there are no residences in the vicinity, Gorman said.

The request will be heard by the County Development Review Committee at 6:30 p.m. in the Old County Courthouse. Though Gorman said Monday no one has objected to the proposal, he expects some opposition.

Objections to other test-hole proposals in the area have centered around potential damage to the water table and lack of reclamation of the drilling locations.

Gorman said the state Oil Conservation Commission has approved the applicant's procedures for controlling seepage of water to lower depths. As a condition of approval, the Land Use Office is offering to check well water levels before and after the test.

Reclamation of the hole and, if the site is abandoned, of the access road would take place within 60 days, according to the application. Drilling would begin around Nov. 15.

# Druggist, 2 Others Charged in Receipt Of Stolen Property

SANTA FE — Intensive questioning of a burglary suspect led to the arrests Thursday of three Santa Fe residents, including well-known pharmacist, on sharges of receiving stolen property from him.

Santa Fe police Capt. Rick Montoya said John S. Gianardi, 49, owner and operator of Gianardi's Fraser Pharmacy, 501 Old Santa Fe Trail, was arrested at the pharmacy Thursday by Detective Dennis Miller.

Gianardi's attorney, Ralph Montez, posted \$10,000 bond, and Gianardi was released from the Santa Fe County jail. He couldn't be reached for comment.

Also arrested were Fred R. Kline, 43, and his wife Susan E. Kline, 39, both of 109 Calle Royale. They, too, were charged with receiving stolen property, Montoya and.

Magistrate Judge Isaac Grchuleta freed both the Klines on \$5,000 bond each. Robert Hi'gentorf, the Klines' attorney, posted Jond.

A fourth person arrested in the pase was Carl Anthony Tsosie, 35, 407 Osage Ave., Montoya said. Tsosie was charged on Wednesday with one count each of embezzlement, burglary and larceny.

Archuleta set Tsosie's bond at 5,000. Tsosie was returned to the younty jail.

Montoya said Miller made the rrests after a Santa Fe man — not sosie — whom he declined to mame was arrested several weeks go on unrelated charges. The man b now a suspect in at least 20 urglaries that occurred in downhown Santa Fe in the last three months, Montoya said.

The suspect told police he sold property to the Klines and to Gianardi.

All the stolen property, consisting of paintings, kachina dolls, cash and other items, has been identified and - returned to the owners, Montoya said.

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
