Gentlemen:

It has come to our attention that you are causing a well to be drilled in the SE/4, NW/4 of Section 28, Township 3 North, Range 9 East, known as the Jack Dean Well No. 1 in Torrance County, New Mexico, without approval of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission as required by State law.

Therefore, you are hereby ordered to suspend all further drilling operations on the above described well until such time as you submitted and received approval of Forms C-101 and C-128 from the Santa Fe Office of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission.

Further, your attention is called to the New Mexico Statutes Annotated, 1953 Compilation, Chapter 65, Article 3, Section 17 which states, "Any person who violates any provision of this Act (65-3-3, 65-3-15, 65-3-17) or any Rules, Regulation, or Order of the Commission made pursuant to this Act shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than \$1,000.00 for each violation. Each day during which such violation is continued shall be considered a separate and complete offense for this purpose."

CONCLUSIONS

1. The first step in the process of identifying a potential threat is to determine the source of the information. This can be done by reviewing the source's history and reputation, as well as by conducting a background check. Once the source has been identified, the next step is to assess the credibility of the information. This can be done by comparing the information to other sources and by evaluating the source's motives. Finally, the information should be analyzed to determine its potential impact on the organization. This can be done by considering the information's relevance to the organization's mission and by evaluating the potential for harm.

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
