This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of February 27th with reference to the above captioned well.


There is no reason, to my knowledge, why these samples on this well from 3600' to 3685' should be kept confidential.

Dear Mr. French:

I have just reviewed your file on the Olsen Means No. 1, and I find that everything is in shape, including the agreement between you and Huling Means, Jr., regarding the water well which was left for him, except we are missing the samples from 3600' to 3685', and we are obligated to have these in the files at the Bureau of Mines before approving your G-103 form.

Should you not be desirous of making these samples public information, there is a method in which we can keep the information confidential for a reasonable period. If this is desired for a period of longer than 90 days, the samples can be placed in a bonded warehouse for a period of 12 months. This may not be the reason, however, that these samples have not been turned over to us, and I am therefore awaiting an answer from you before doing anything further regarding your well.

AGREEMENT

In consideration of the sum of \$1.00 and other valuable considerations, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the R. Olsen Oil Company, Jal, New Mexico, does hereby sell to Euling Means, Jr., Estancia, New Mexico, the well known officially as the Olsen-Means #1, located in the N44W section 27, Township 7 north, Range 9 east, Torrance County, New Mexico, for use as a water well.

The R. Olsen Oil Company hereby certifies that this well was plugged in accordance with the Oil Conservation Commission requirements, which are as follows:

- 125 sack plug from total depth of 3516 ft. to 3235 ft.
- 9.8 lbs. mud from 3235 ft. to 572 ft.
- 75 sack plug from 572 ft. to 370 ft.
- Open hole from 370 ft. to bottom of 13-3/8" surface casing at 275 ft. was left open to allow the water well completion in this zone.

Euling Means, Jr. agrees to complete this well as a water well within 60 days from June 12, 1950. If the well is not completed as a water well within this period, Mr. Means agrees to complete plugging by using 50 sack plug beginning at 370 ft. or top of present plug and extending upwards into the 13-3/8" casing as far as 50 sacks of cement will allow. In the event the hole is full of water, the cement must be dumped from the bailer.

Mr. Means further agrees that if the plug is necessary, he will advise the Oil Conservation Commission at least 24 hours before the plugging operations begin.

Gentlemen:

We acknowledge receipt of your C-101 covering the captioned well and surveyor's plat. We wish to stress the fact that you are drilling within the limits of the Estancia Valley water basin.

This Commission believes that setting your casing at 300 feet and circulating cement to the top will be satisfactory, provided that you maintain a good water shut off while drilling. It is imperative that we have at least 24 hours notice before you run your surface casing so that we, or the State Engineer's office, may witness the operation.

Also, four copies of the log of the first 600 feet should be sent to this office as soon as possible after reaching that depth, in order that the State Engineer's office may be advised of the section drilled.





Dear Sirs:

We are in receipt of your Form C-103, Report on Result of Casing Shut-off, which was sent to our Hobbs office and approved by Mr. Roy Yarbrough.

We would like to call your attention to Rule 1301, of our Rules and Regulations, which outlines the districts under the jurisdiction of each office. You will note that your well in Torrance County is under the jurisdiction of the Santa Fe office and in the future, all reports should be sent here. We are particularly desirous of maintaining this procedure in areas involving drilling through a designated artesian or underground water reservoir as designated by the State Engineer. In all cases where this occurs we are cooperating with the State Engineer's Office in protecting these waters, and in all cases wish to have a representative present when casing shut off test is made. By doing this, we hope to head off the possibility of an operator having to drill under the direction of both the Oil Conservation Commission and the State Engineer's Office.

In order for us to have a representative present, it will be necessary for you to submit the required C-102 as per Rule 1105 of the Rules and Regulations, which gives us notice of your intention. As stated above, all forms should be submitted to and approved by the Santa Fe office for this Torrance County well. Forms approved in any other office will not be recognized by us.

Witnessed plugging operation in cooperation with Mr. Crawford, of State Engineer's Office. Mr. Hackleman and Mr. John Trench, of Olsen Oil Company were present.

An agreement was reached between Crawford, Huling Means, Jr., Hackleman, Trench and myself, regarding plugging, as follows:

125 sq. plug in bottom of hole. 3235-3516.

75 sq. plug topped at 370 ft. Heavy mud between plugs.

13-5/8" casing to 275' cemented top to bottom. 95' open hole for Mr. Means to make a water well. Means agrees in writing to test this zone for water and if it does not make a well, to plug with cement to 265 ft. and cap hole.

Hole was bottomed in granite boulders, with reported red beds from 305 to 3500.
