Dear Mr. Ulvog,

Enclosed please find the forms C-103 and C-105. I finally had a marker made locating the dry hole. It will be put up within the next few days.

Reading the reports, we had a terrible time with this well. We set 80' of 12" casing along with 125' of 8 5/8". We encountered water at only one area, 37'. The water was only about 12' deep. We circulated cement to surface and let set for about 19 hours. At about 735' we were sticking our drill pipe, after the third time, I decided to pull out and plug the well. We were afraid to run a logging tool down the hole and with the advice of my geologist, we did not. He use to be with the Texas Railroad Commission.

My geologist studied my samples and there was never any kind of trace of hydrocarbons.

In conclusion, I keep remembering what you said over the phone the first time I spoke with you. "An oil well in Union County, yours will be the only One." Mr Ulvog, I appreciate you help very much. If I need to do anything else please advise.
