Dear Sir:

I have your letter of June 17.

I cannot understand how Mr. Gruemmer could have been so confused about our requirements as they are not misleading or confusing and anyone with a normal command of his elements can follow instructions as that is essentially what our rules and regulations entail. However a busy executive of today may forestall incidentals if it is to his convenience.

Presently I am concerned over Mr. Gruemmer's submitting the Well Record, Form C-105, on this well. Of course, for this report to be complete, the correct production data must also be included. I am aware of the fact that the Des Moines plant started up the latter part of March and assuming that same has been running since then the operator is delinquent two months in filing of the Extraction Plant Monthly Report, Oil Conservation Commission Form C-114, Sheets 1 & 2. Also on Form C-105 the "formation tops" reflects the geologic formation encountered whereas the Formation Record is a driller's log showing formation, lithologically speaking, or rock layers penetrated.

We are lacking a report on the last casing job (production string) showing size of casing used as generally worded in the industry, depth to which casing run and amount of the cement, in sacks, employed if casing was cemented. I am aware of 8 5/8" CD casing's having been run to 2256' and seated, not cemented. If this is the case then they should state so.

Now concerning the anticipated remedial work, a notice of intention with dates, should be forth coming, on our Form C-102 and it may be classified as a recompletion. You mention some liquid's having been allowed to enter with the carbon dioxide at the bottom of the casing. I assume that this is water. This intrusion would not have occurred if the casing had been properly cemented rather than seated.
