Dear Mrs. Morgan:

To answer the questions raised by your letter of September 12, 1977, I am attaching hereto a copy of Rule 202 from Oil Conservation Commission Regulations together with a copy of Order No. R-5297 and Memo No. 10-76. From this it will be apparent that the temporary abandonment permit for the subject well expired 1/8/77 but was automatically extended to October 1, 1977 by Order No. R-5297. However, all temporary abandonment permits will terminate on October 1, next, unless a later date is specified by the permit. Consequently, it appears that you would need another permit, this being obtained from the Commission's Director, in order to continue the well's shut-in status. Presumably such a permit could be obtained without a hearing, as discussed by the fourth paragraph of Rule 202-B.

In view of the above, I am also sending copies of Form C-103 for your use in applying for a temporary abandonment (or shut-in) permit. If you have other questions or need additional information, please advise.
