The Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has reviewed the reports available in the OCD Online Imaging website referenced above. The most relevant document is summarized below.

14Feb92 Buys & Assoc **Addendum Site Remediation Closure Report HOMCO International Inc, Location 151 Facility, Farmington, New Mexico** describes sampling and cleanup activities done in 1991. Soil sample results from excavation work on site showed compliance with OCD soil cleanup guidelines for total petroleum hydrocarbons and aromatic hydrocarbons (BTEX). Some contaminated soil remained which was covered by a concrete cap which prevents migration of hydrocarbons. Groundwater in the area was thought to be less than 50 feet below surface at that time. The report recommended that no further excavation or remedial action was required.

I concur with this recommendation and no further corrective action is required. This finding by the OCD does not relieve the landowner of responsibility if future information shows a threat to ground water, surface water, human health, or the environment. Further, it does not relieve the landowner of responsibility for compliance with any federal, state, or local law. If you have additional questions, please feel free to call.
