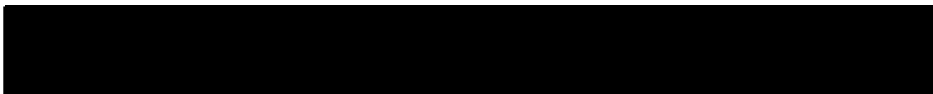



Notice is hereby given that pursuant to New Mexico Water Quality Control Commission (WQCC) Regulations, the following discharge plan application has been submitted to the Director of the Oil Conservation Division, 1220 South St. Francis Dr., Santa Fe, New Mexico 87505, Telephone (505) 476-3440:

(GW-349) - Phillips Pipe Line Company, Anthony C. Walker (Project Manager), 3811 Adams Bldg., Bartlesville, Oklahoma 74004, has submitted a discharge plan application for the remediation of contaminated ground water at the Line NM-1-1 Site located in the SW 1/4 SW 1/4, of Section 9, Township 19 South, Range 38 East NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. The application addresses discharges to ground water associated with the remediation of petroleum contaminated ground water. Approximately 60 gallons per minute of contaminated ground water is to be processed through a treatment system to remove contaminants to below WQCC ground water standards prior to re-injection into 8 injection wells. Groundwater most likely to be affected by the discharge is at a depth of approximately 27 feet with a total dissolved solids concentration of approximately 1000 mg/l. The discharge plan addresses system operation and monitoring, and how spills, leaks, and other accidental discharges to the surface will be managed.

Any interested person may obtain further information from the Oil Conservation Division and may submit written comments to the Director of the Oil Conservation Division at the address given above. The discharge plan application may be viewed between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, at the above address or at the Oil Conservation Division Hobbs District Office, 1625 N. French Dr., Hobbs, NM. Prior to ruling on any proposed discharge plan or its modification, the Director of the Oil Conservation Division shall allow at least thirty (30) days after the date of publication of this notice during which comments may be submitted and a public hearing may be requested by any interested person. Request for public hearing shall set forth the reasons why a hearing shall be held. A hearing will be held if the Director determines that there is significant public interest. If no hearing is held, the Director will approve or disapprove the plan based on the information available. If a public hearing is held, the Director will approve the plan based on the information in the plan and information presented at the hearing.


