Dear Mr. Casey:

There has been a great deal of confusion on the part of Hanover Insurance Company with respect to the Powers-Marshall Well in Harding County, New Mexico (Section 34, Township 21 North, Range 30 East). However, on June 20th we did receive a copy of the cementing report for this well (Texas Railroad Commission Form W-15) which you had submitted to the bonding company in December, 1976. A cover letter with that report stated that the site had been restored and that you would contact this office for inspection and approval of same. On July 18th, last, I visited the location and observed that it had been worked over. Therefore, if you will complete the enclosed forms, giving the full plugging and clearing data, we can approve them, cancel the bond and close our files.

You will recall that I met with you at the well site on November 29, 1976, and from there we visited several other locations in need of plugging and/or clean up work. One of these other locations is in Section 22, Township 15 North, Range 33 East, also in Harding County, about 10 miles due north of Logan. This is a Harvest Oil Inc. (or Astro-Tex) well which apparently belongs to a Mr. Stanley J. Pirtle with whom you have been in contact. A copy of his letter dated 12/10/76 was sent here. From this it appears that you would have the job of plugging his well. Have any arrangements been made for such work? If not, perhaps you would like to investigate the Davis #1 State well (specifics attached) for the purpose of bidding for that
