Please rest assured that we shall do everything in our power to arrive at a solution of this problem or Mr. Timmons will suffer the consequences. He is still liable to this Commission as he owns and operates a carbon dioxide gathering and distributing plant at Pueyeros, New Mexico, the operation of which still falls under our jurisdiction.

If you can shed any further light on the subject concerning your attempts to secure his cooperation there in Denver, please advise me of same.
