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Gentlemen:

Reference is made to the C-101, Notice of Intention to Drill, for the above-captioned well, approved by this office June 15, 1956.

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Your attention is called to the well location as described on the C-101. It should read "330 feet from the East line" rather than "330 feet from the West line" as it now does. The well location should also be marked as being in Unit "A", both in the written description and in the small plat on the C-101.

We also failed to insert the following statement in the exception space below the approval date on the C-101: "Collect and sack samples for New Mexico Bureau of Mines, Socorro, at at least ten feet intervals."

Please make the above described changes in your copies of the Notice of Intention to Drill.

The cuttings samples may be saved and mailed to the Bureau of Mines at Socorro upon completion of the well.
