Permian Wildcat in Northeastern New Mexico Abandoned

A remote wildcat drilled by Mickey Blackwell, Tulia, Texas, about 34 miles north-northwest of Clayton, New Mexico, has been completed as a 1050-ft dry hole. The 2 Farr, nw ne 6-31n-34e, northeastern Union County, found hydrocarbon shows at about 810 ft, but few details have been disclosed. The scheduled Glorieta test, about three miles south of the Colorado line, offsets to the northwest a 510-ft dry hole in nw ne 6-31n-34e which flowed gas from Granite Wash between 360 and 420 ft before being plugged in 1967. The area is approximately 40 miles north of Bravo Dome field, a carbon dioxide gas area, and 95 miles northeast of Wagon Mound-Dakota field.
