Gentlemen:

I have now had an opportunity to talk to Mr. Gruemmer again about the form C-103 which has not yet been filed with you. His failure to file this form now results from his confusion about your requirements.

He tells me that Nelson-Moore Development Company, the driller of the well, as a result of inexperience in drilling CO₂ wells, failed properly to complete the bottom casing. As a result of this improper casing, liquid was allowed to enter with the CO₂, and accurate bottom hole pressure and quantity estimates were impossible to be obtained. The geologist who tested the well reported his inability in this respect, and the company has now employed a new driller, from Elmer, Texas, to do the work required.

Will you want separate reports for each operation? A report on the previous completion would necessarily not be accurate, as you see. The new work will be completed within four or five days and an accurate report can be given you from it. We are willing to file two reports if you so desire, since we have the information from the first operation. If we give you two reports, is the second report a "recompletion operation"?
