The OCD has denied the submitted Variance Request for incident # NRM2006951654 58481 WQU PIPELINE @ H-20-22S-26E ON 0E for the following reasons:

• SMA/Enterprise requests a variance of 19.15.29.12(D)(1)(c) NMAC to collect 19 closure samples in the overspray area that encompasses approximately 36,800 square feet, i.e. one sample every 2000 square feet. SMA/Enterprise proposes to use the Visual Sample Plan (VSP) software tool, which was created by the Department of Energy. Considering that the release occurred in a tributary that flows directly to a significant watercourse, and is located within a 100-year floodplain in a critical karst occurrence potential area, the OCD believes that the proposed variance does not provide equal or better protection of freshwater, public health and the environment -19.15.29.14.A.(1) & (2) NMAC-.
