Dear Mr. Westall:

Reference is made to your request received by the Division on May 3, 2004 to increase the surface injection pressure on the Amoco Federal Well No. 3. This request is based on a step rate test conducted on the well on April 22, 2004. The results of the step rate test show that an increase in the surface injection pressure for this well is justified and will not result in the fracturing of the injection formation and confining strata.

You are therefore authorized to increase the surface injection pressure on the following well:
